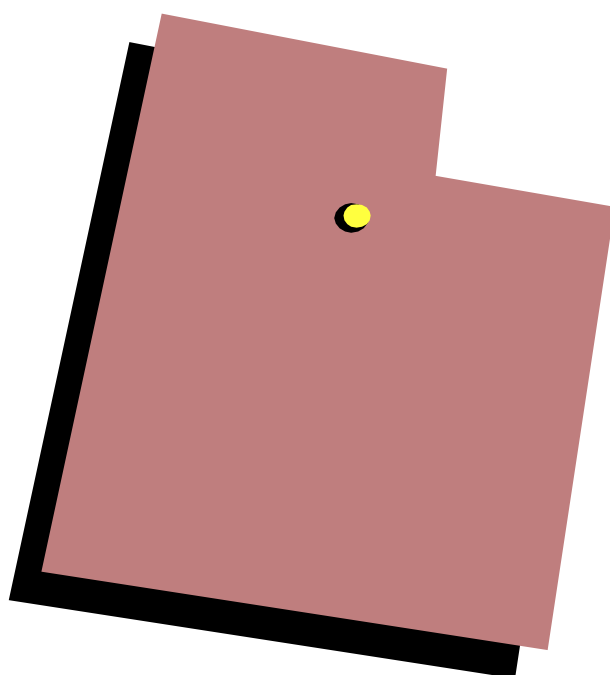

LOCAL, PERSONAL, AND CENTRALLY
ASSESSED PROPERTY

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OVERVIEW

All taxable property in Utah is valued at 100 percent of its fair market value, based upon its location and status as of January 1st each year.

Fair market value less any exemptions equals taxable value¹. Taxable value is the value against which the tax rate is applied to compute taxes charged.

Currently, primary residential properties receive a 45% exemption.² Primary residential property is any dwelling used as a person's primary residence, including condominiums, apartments and rental property, and includes up to one acre of land. The taxable value of all other properties is 100% of fair market value.

This report deals with taxable value.² The calculation of taxable value is illustrated in the table below.

Tax rates are a percentage of taxable value and are not expressed as mills or dollars per hundred of assessed value. Rates are set under a statutory process known as Truth in Taxation. It requires public notice and hearings in the event a taxing entity plans to increase its property tax revenues above the previous year's levy, exclusive of revenue from new growth.

Utah motor vehicles are charged a fee in lieu of property taxes. Throughout our statistical report, this will be called "fee-in-lieu".

The 2000 data contained in this report is year-end data as of December 31, 2000. The historical valuation and tax data are based upon interim reports and do not reflect year-end data.

¹ Taxable Value is always expressed as a percentage of fair market value (e.g. $fmv \times .55$). Fair market value is the most probable sale price of a property in terms of money in a competitive and open market.

Further on in this report Graph 1 displays the distribution of taxable value and taxes charged for 2000. About 73% of the dollars involve real property, 16% includes personal property and fee-in-lieu, and roughly 11% comprise centrally assessed properties. Graphs 2 through 5 give more detailed value and tax breakouts. Graphs 7 and 8 rank value and taxes by county. Graph 9 ranks county tax rates.

Having described where Utah's property tax revenue comes from, we now discuss how it gets spent. Graph 6 shows the distribution of taxes: (1) Schools - 54%; (2) Counties- 20%; (3) Cities and Towns - 15%; and (4) Special Districts - 10% for 2000

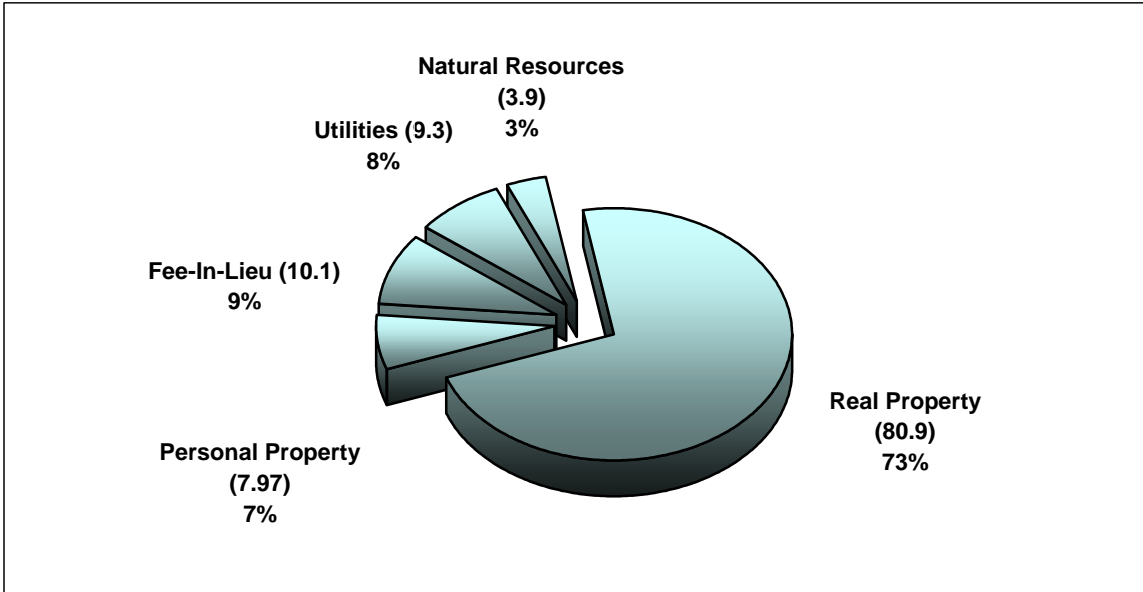

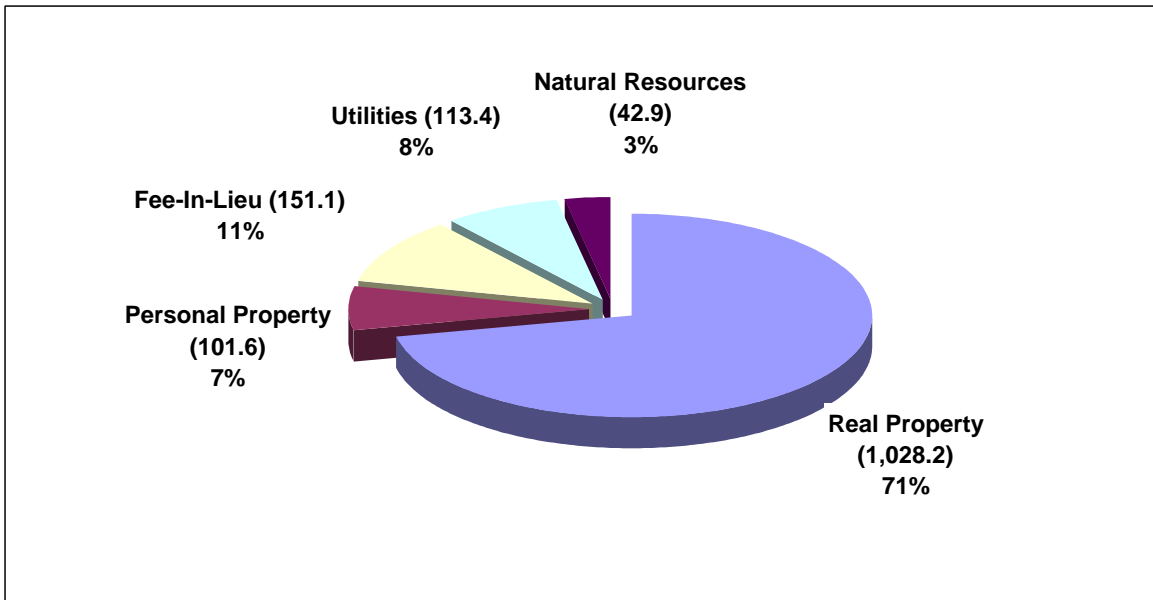

TYPE FOR 2000**



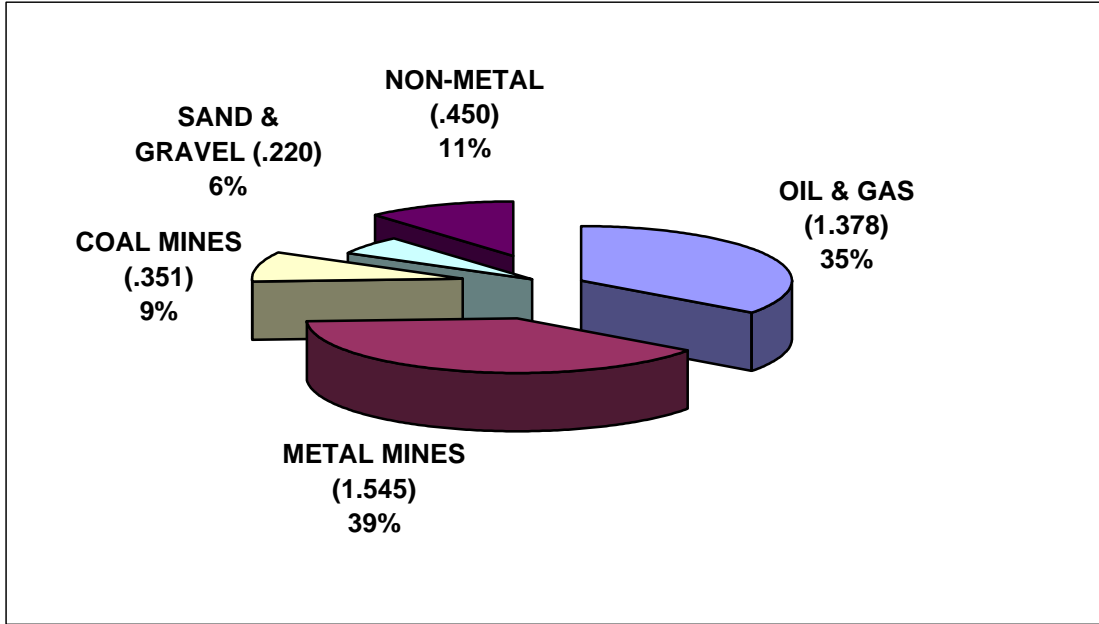

TYPE FOR 2000**



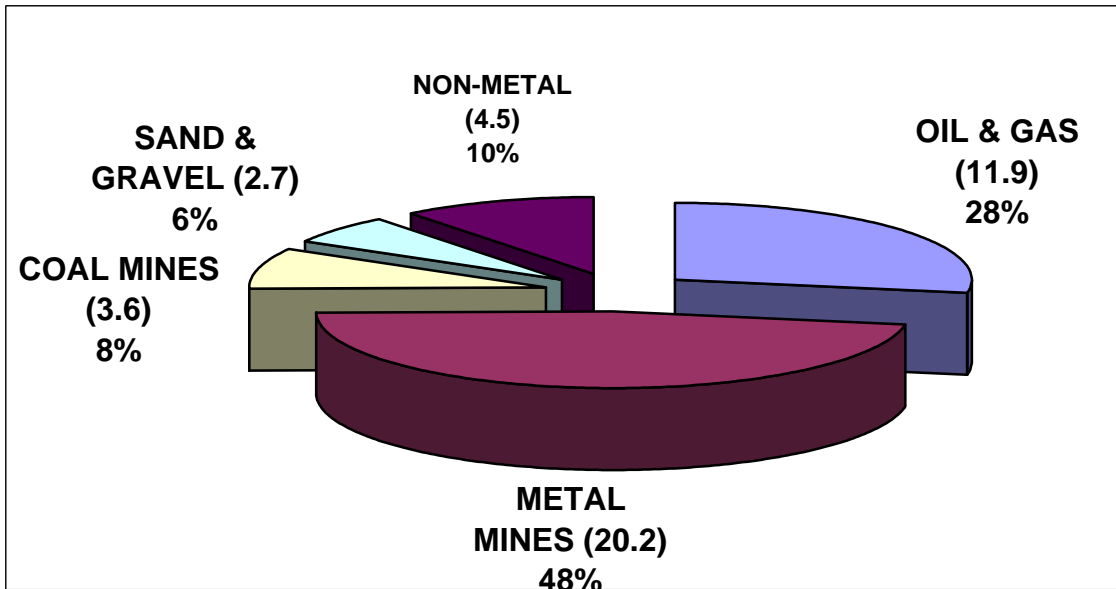

NATURAL RESOURCES



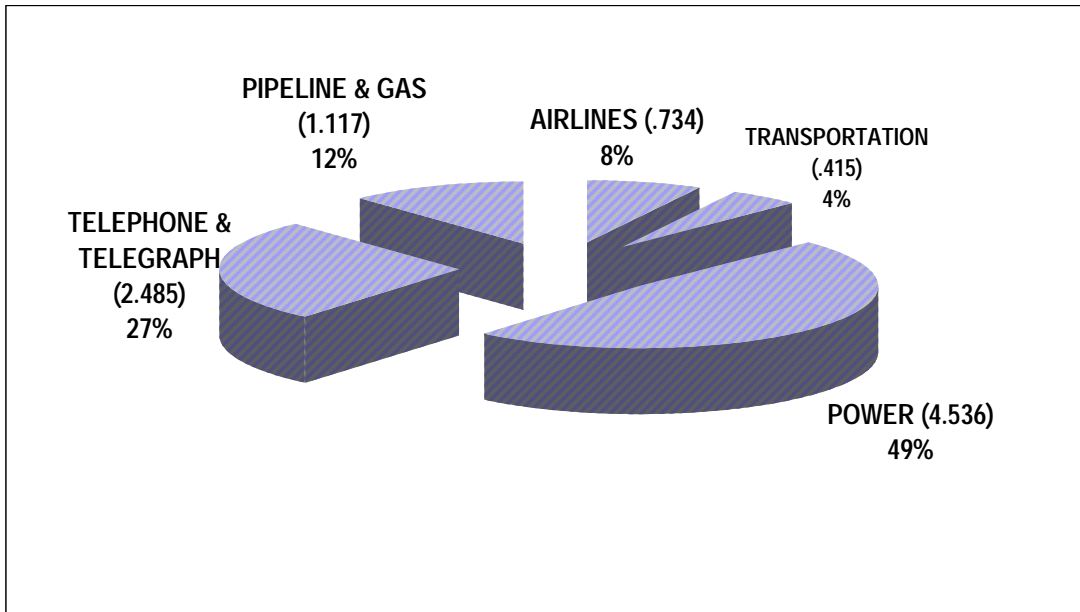

NATURAL RESOURCES



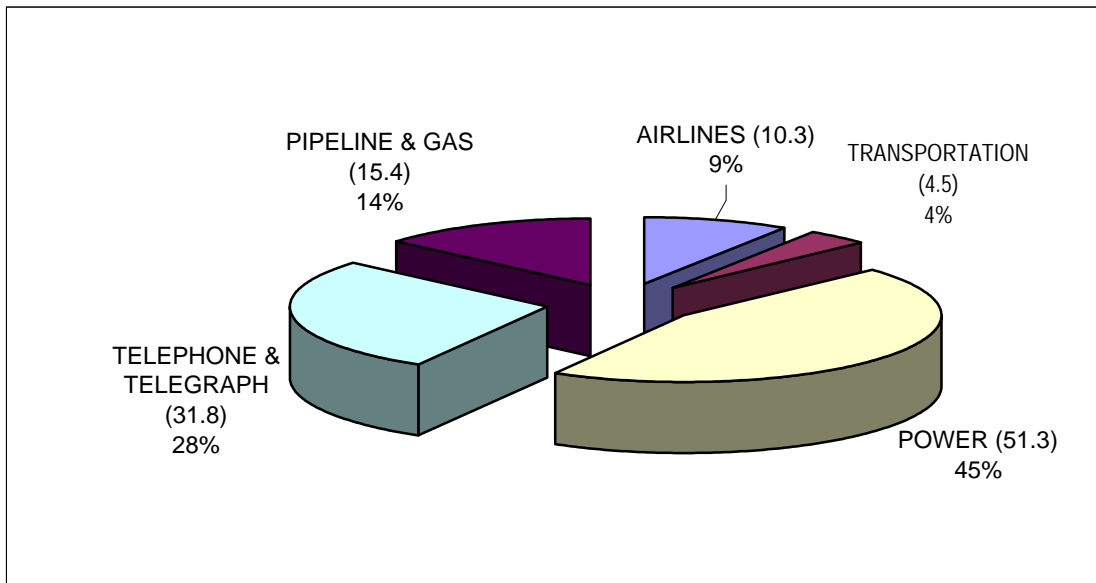
TAXES IN MILLIONS OF DOLLARS

UTILITIES**



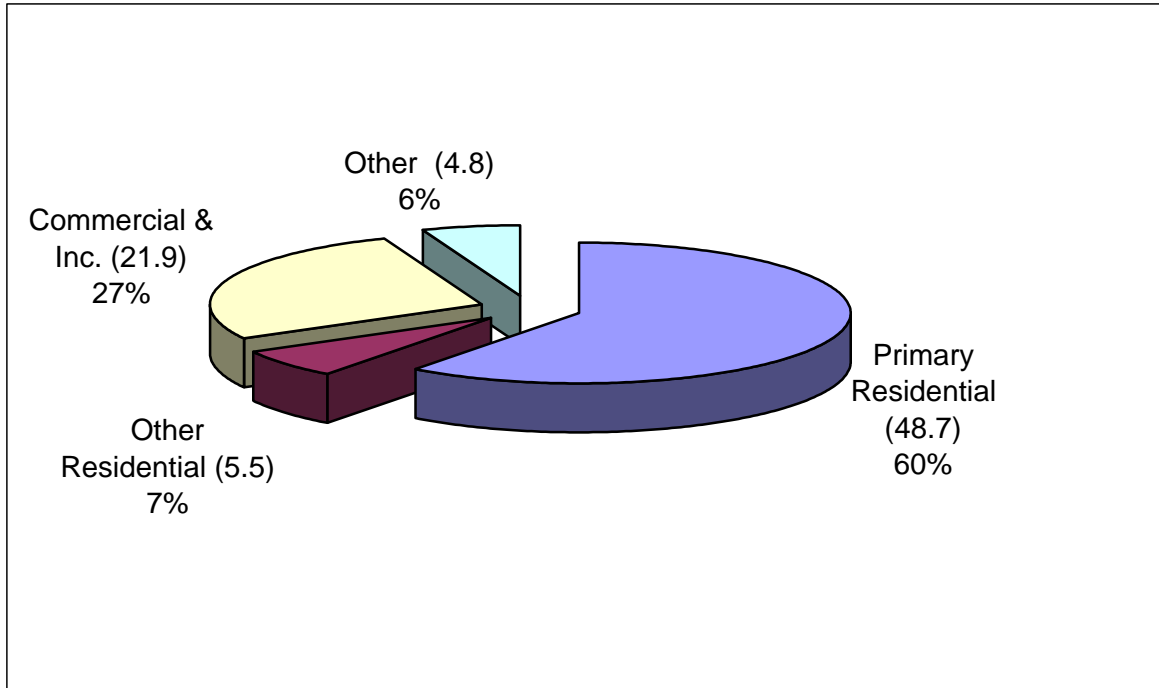

UTILITIES**

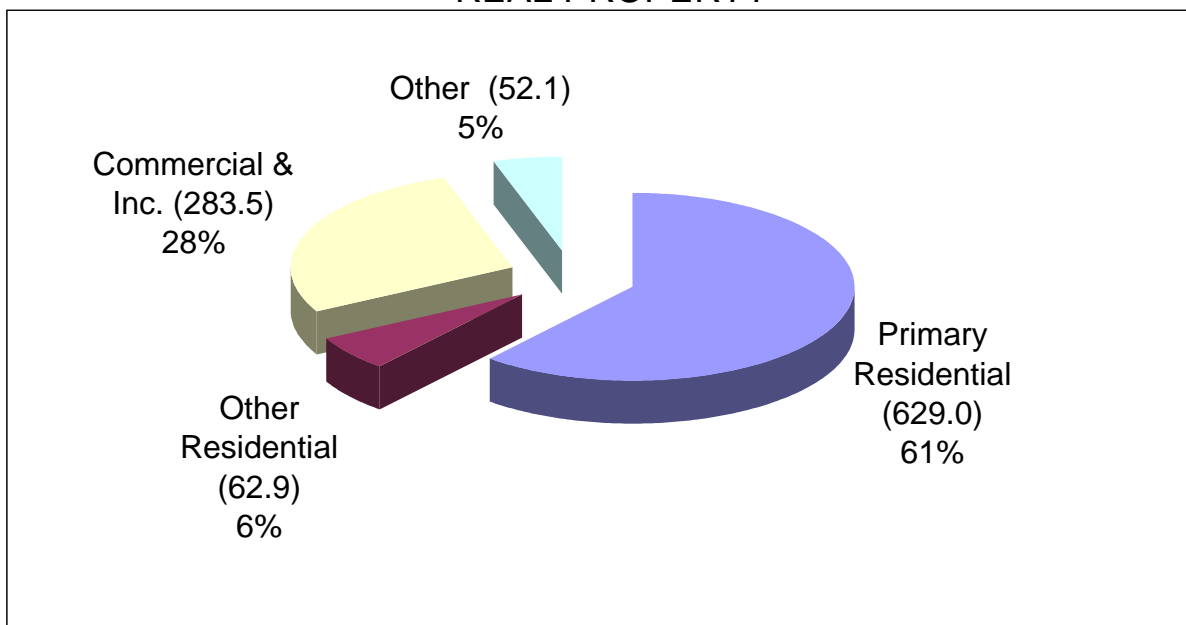

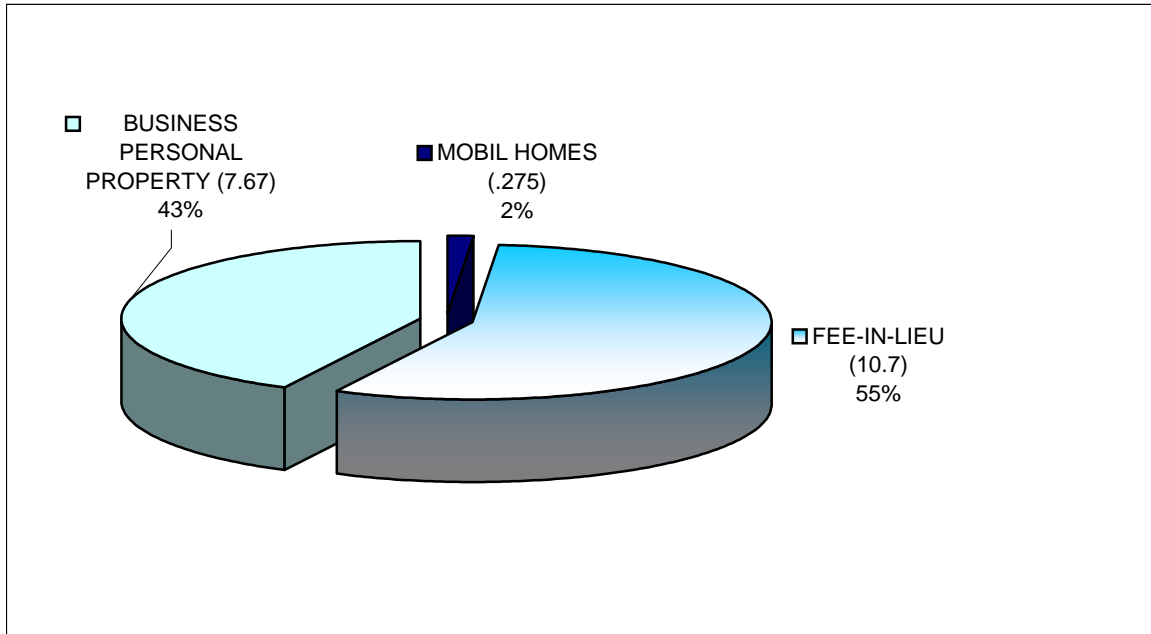
GRAPH - 4

REAL PROPERTY



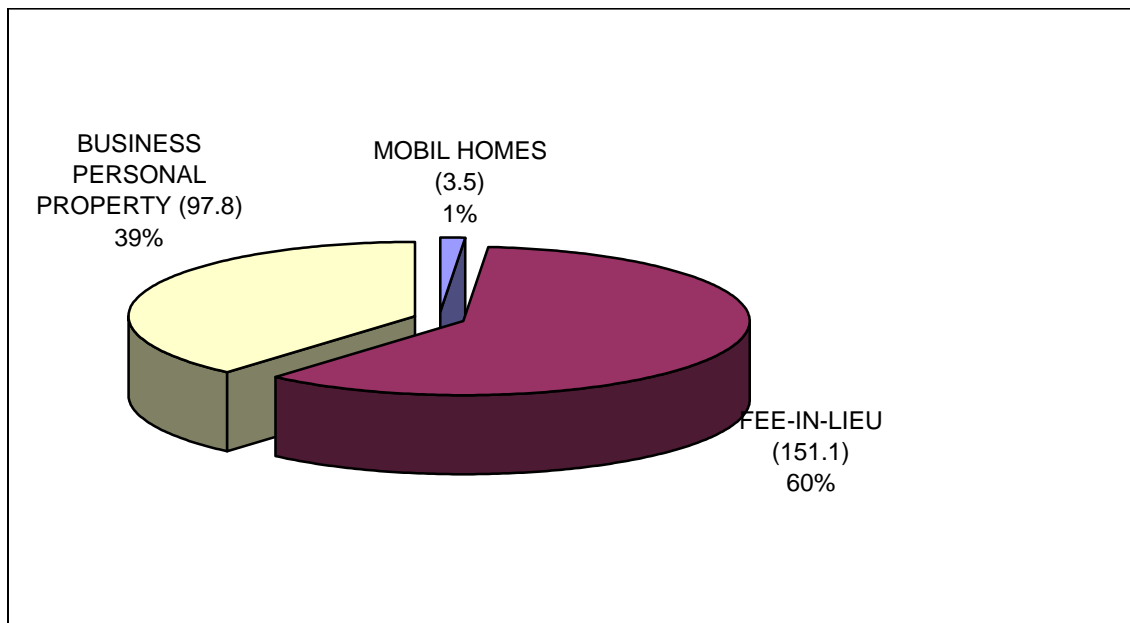
STATEWIDE TAXES CHARGED FOR 2000 LOCALLY ASSESSED
REAL PROPERTY



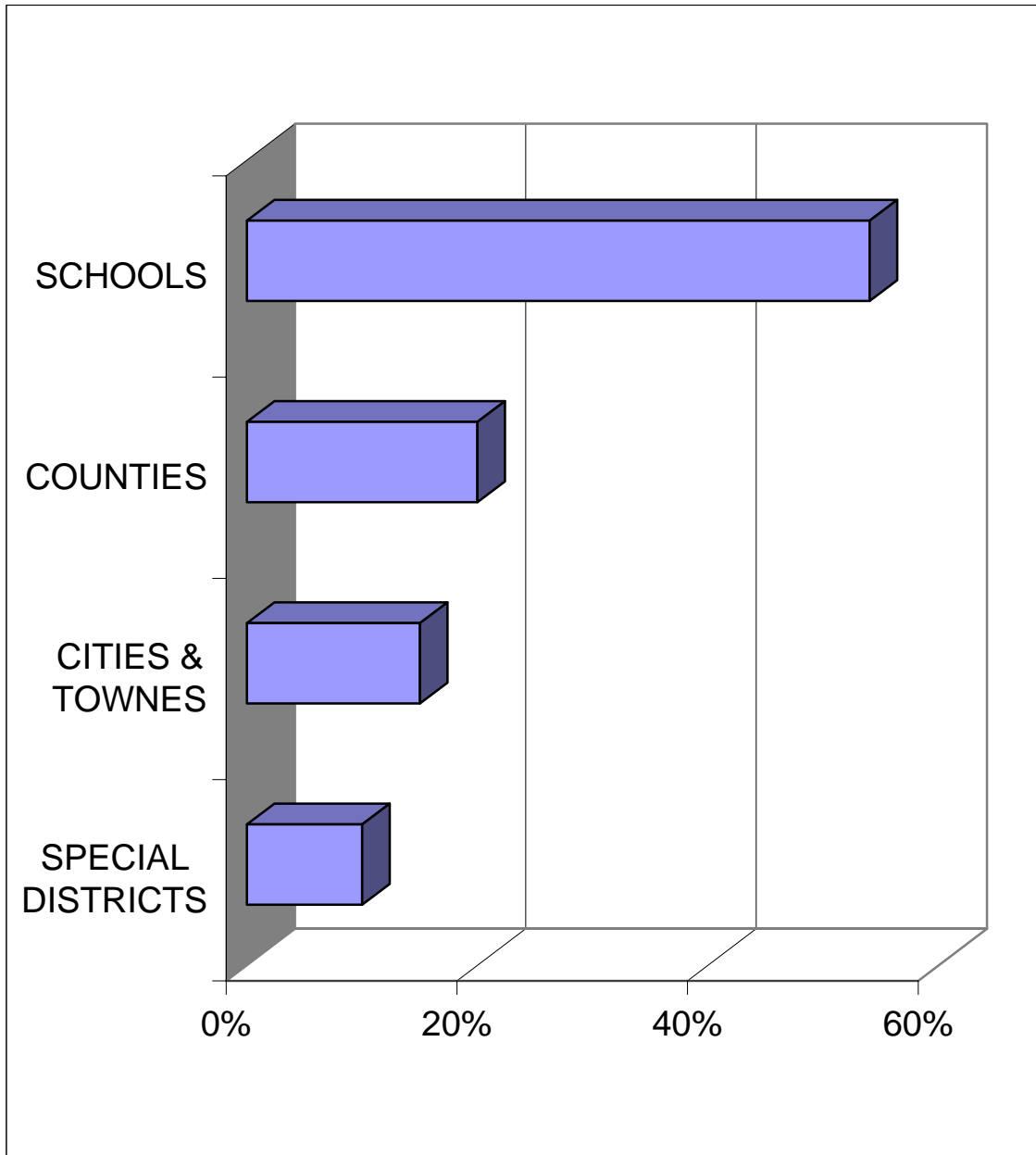
GRAPH - 5

PERSONAL PROPERTY



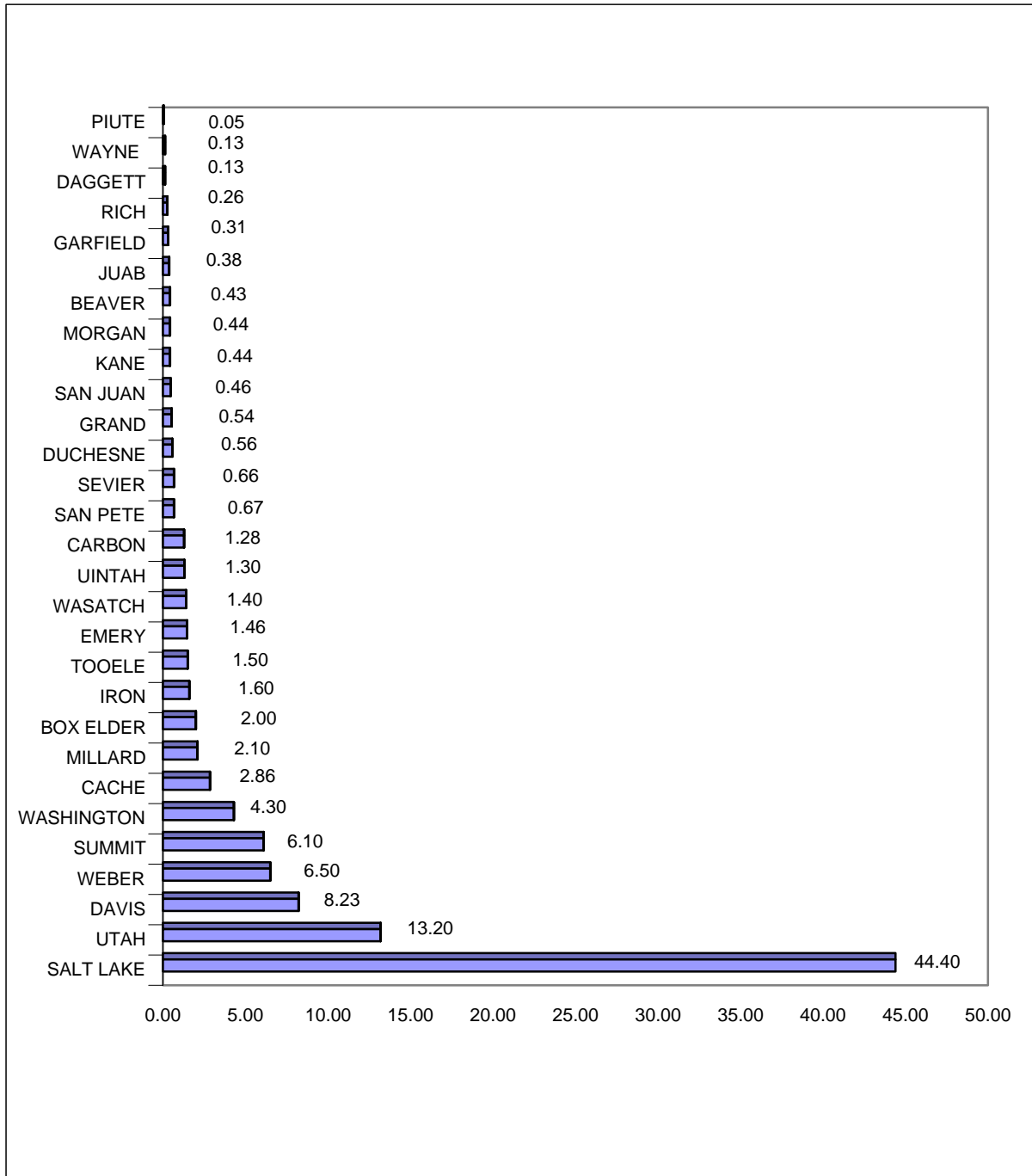
STATEWIDE TAXES CHARGED FOR 2000 LOCALLY ASSESSED

DISTRIBUTION OF TAXES BY TYPE OF ENTITY FOR 2000

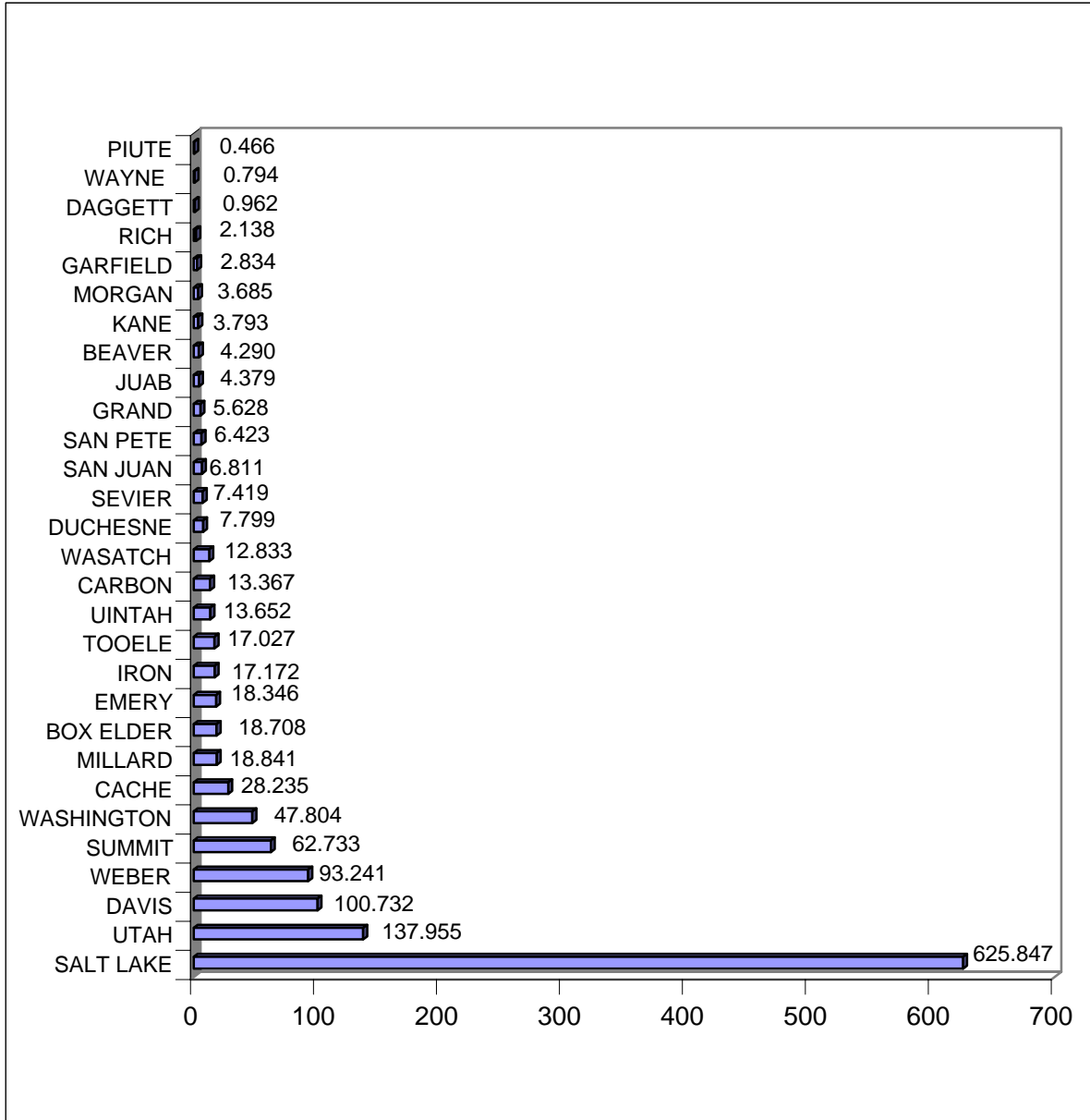

FOR 2000

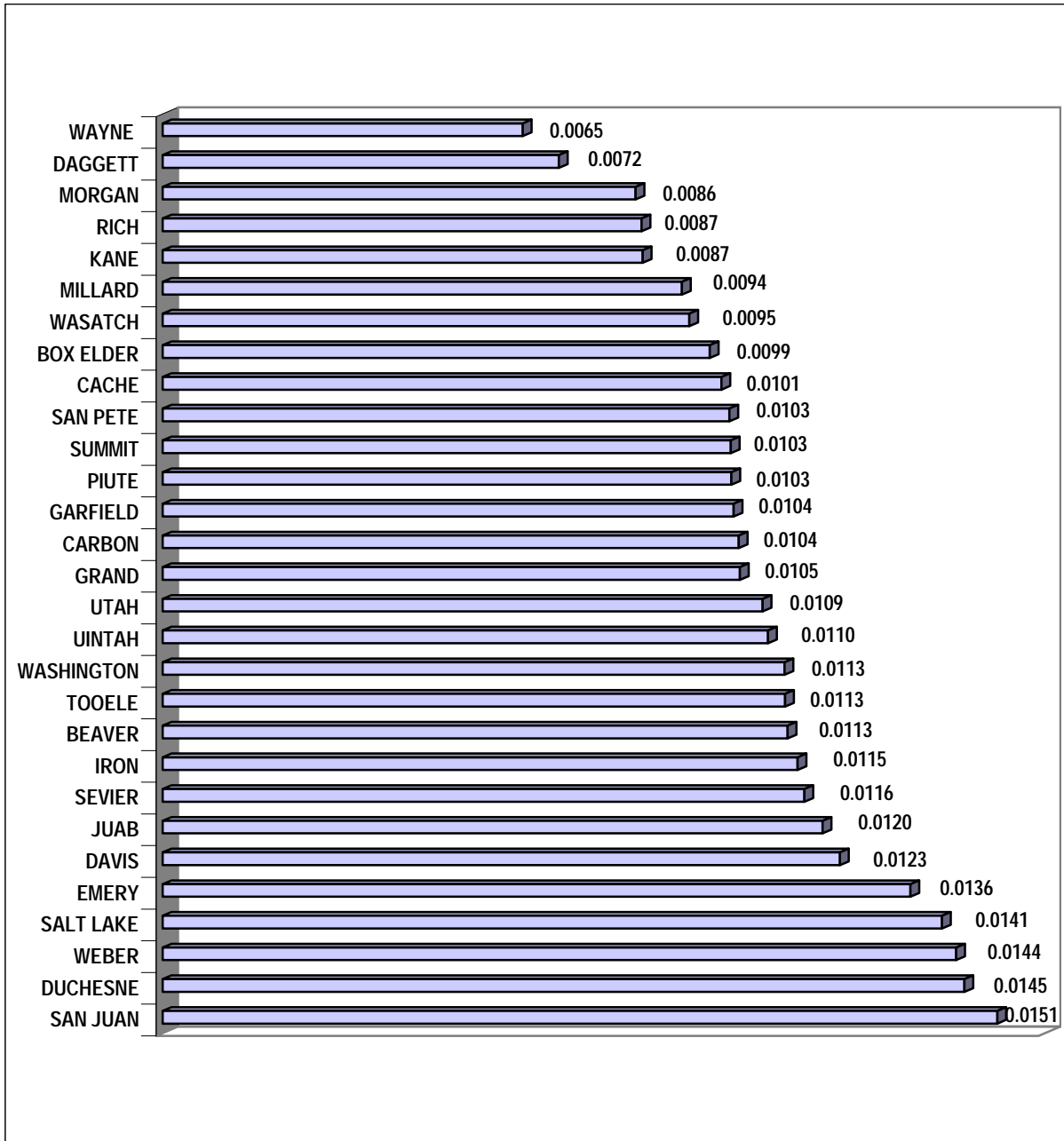

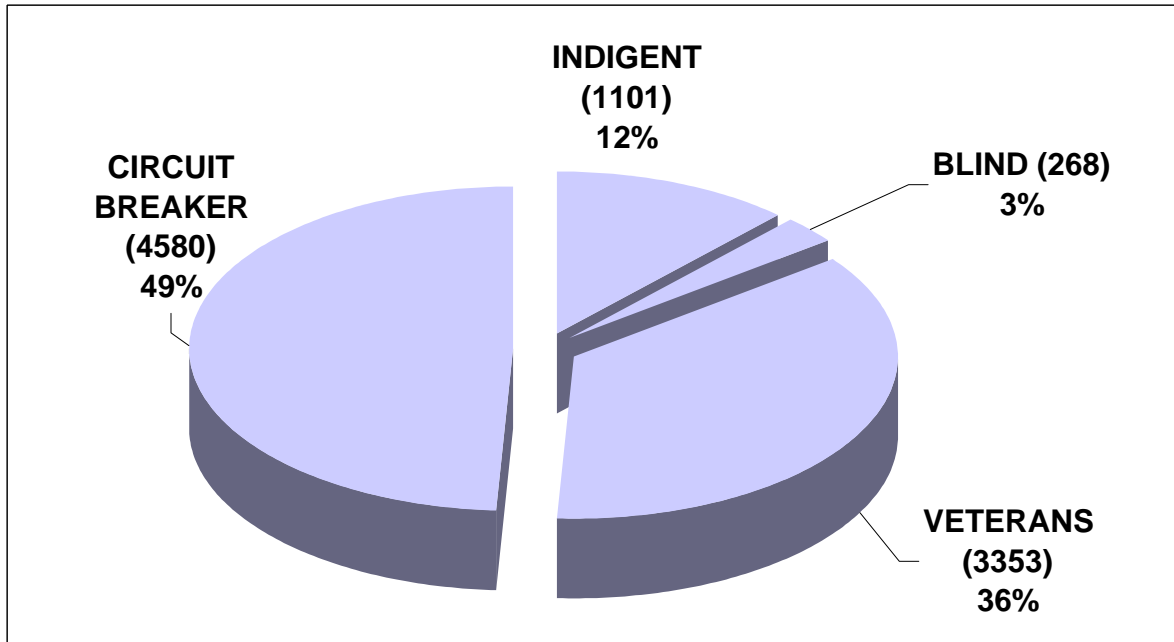

WEIGHTED AVERAGE TAX RATES RANKED BY COUNTY FOR 2000



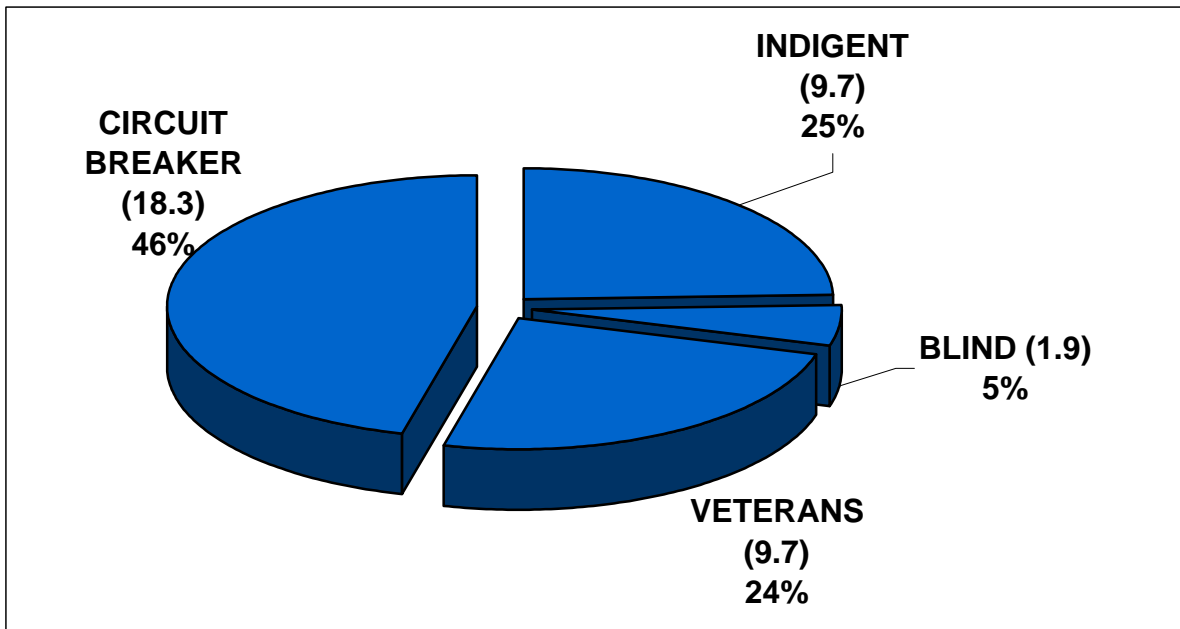
WEIGHTED TAX RATES

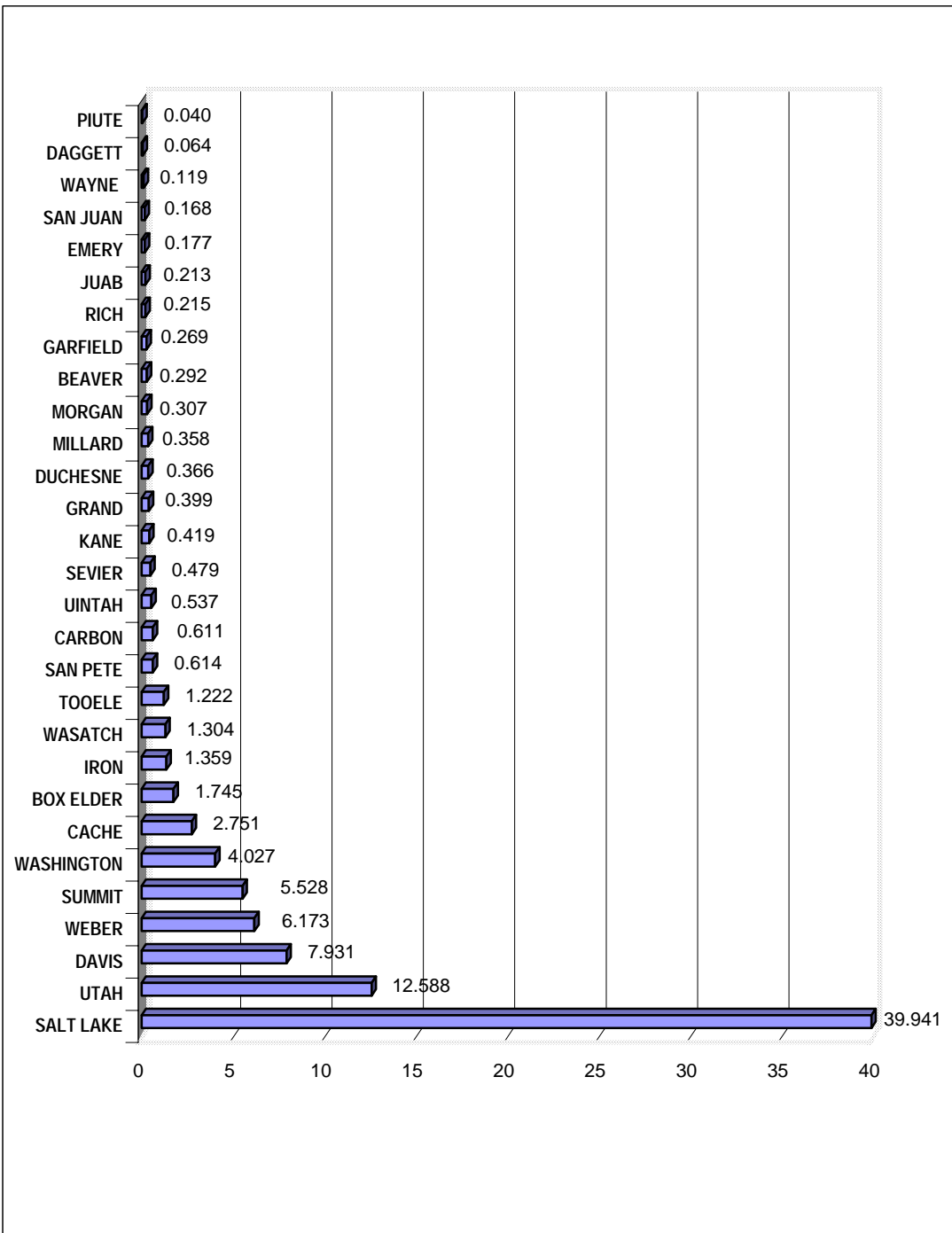

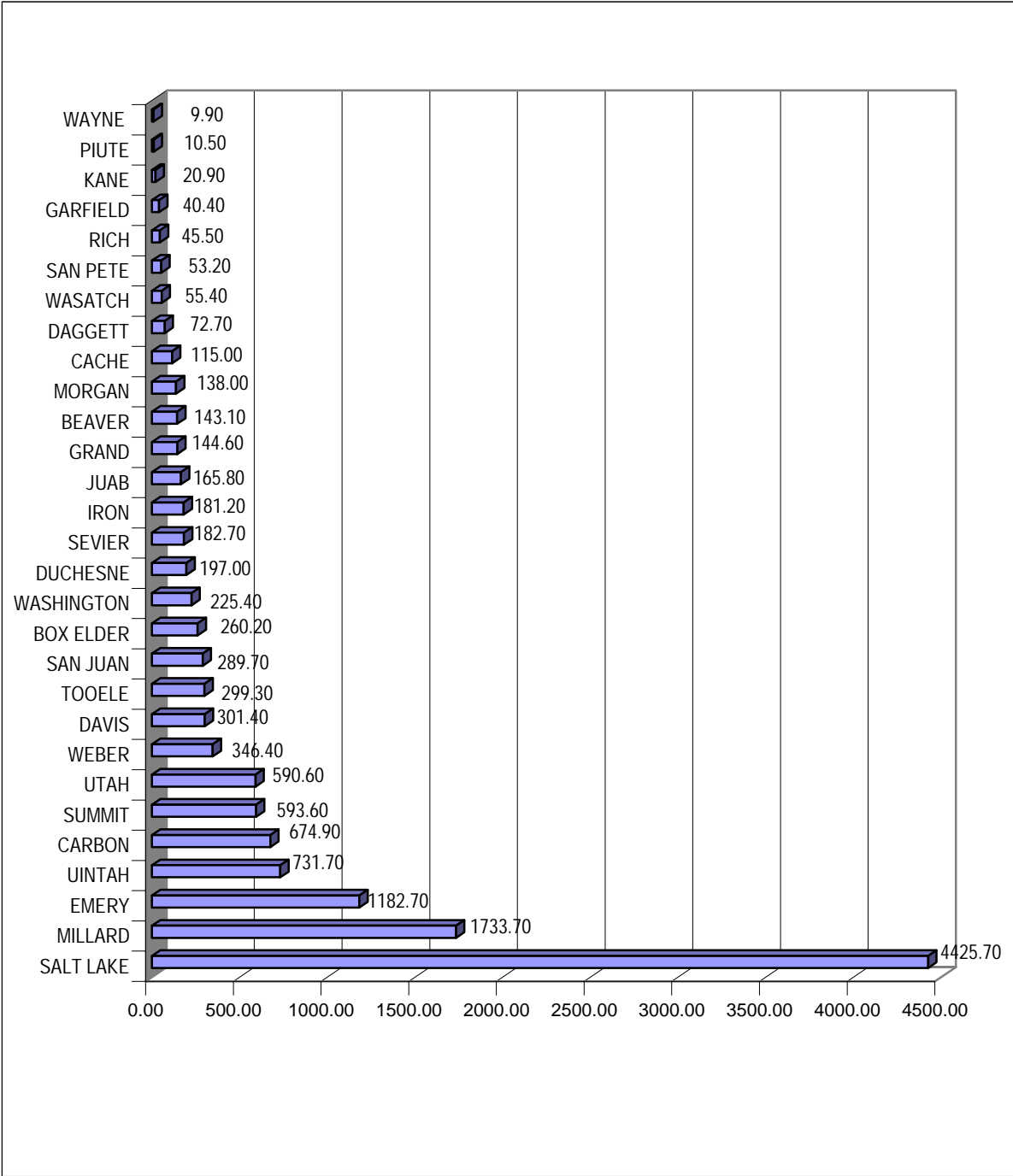

2000

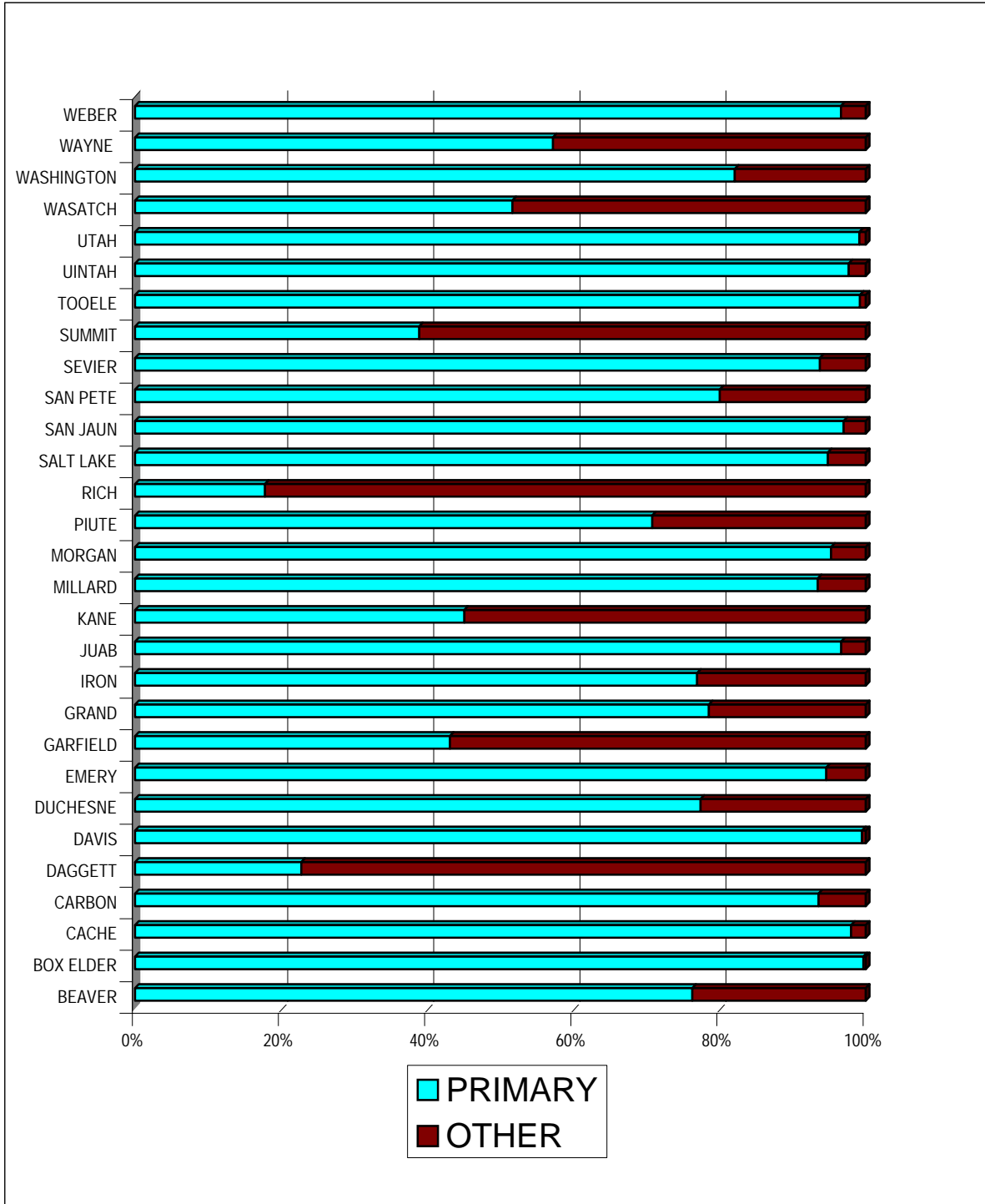

PRIMARY AND OTHER RESIDENTIAL TAXES CHARGED BY COUNTY FOR 2000

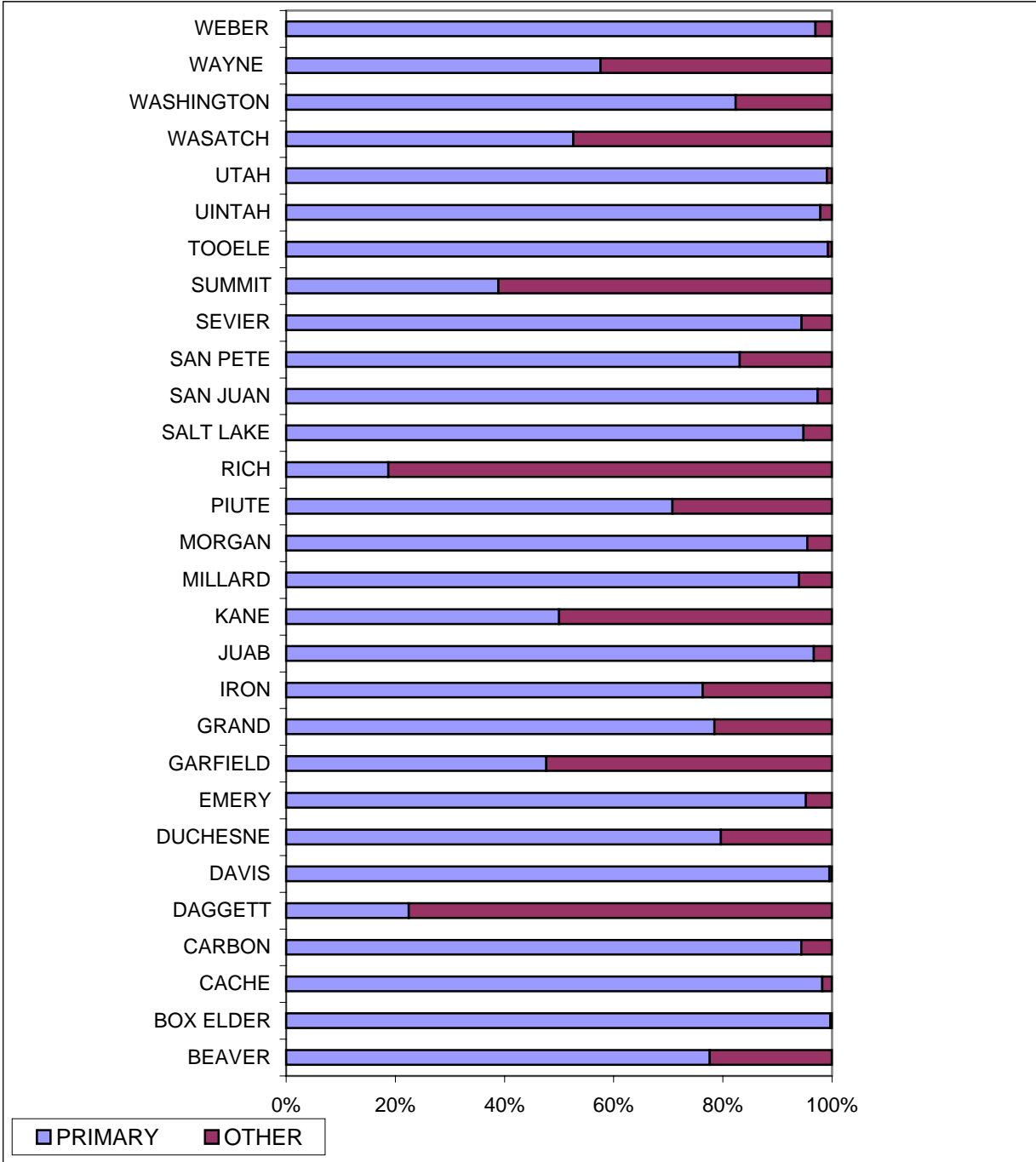

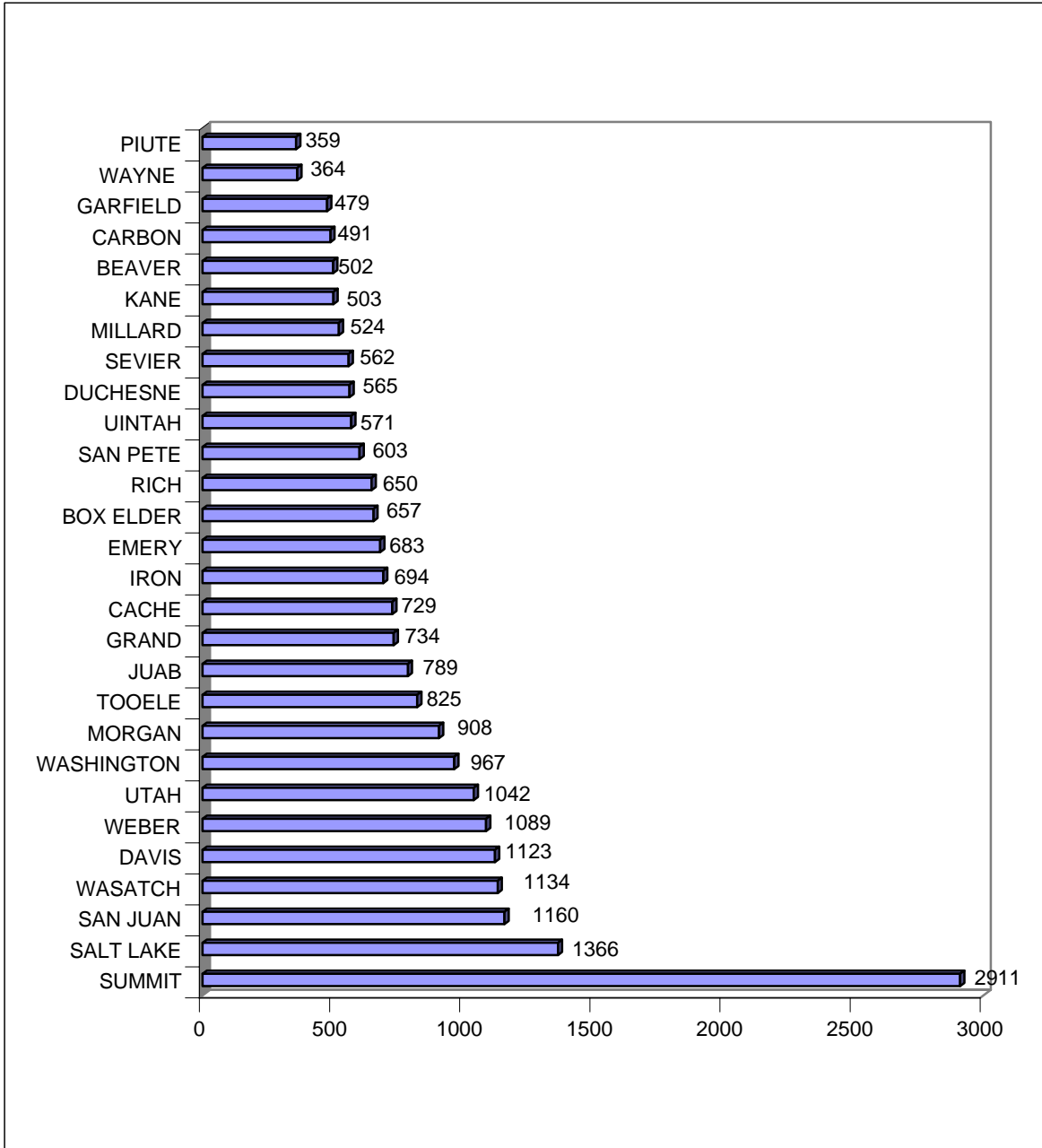

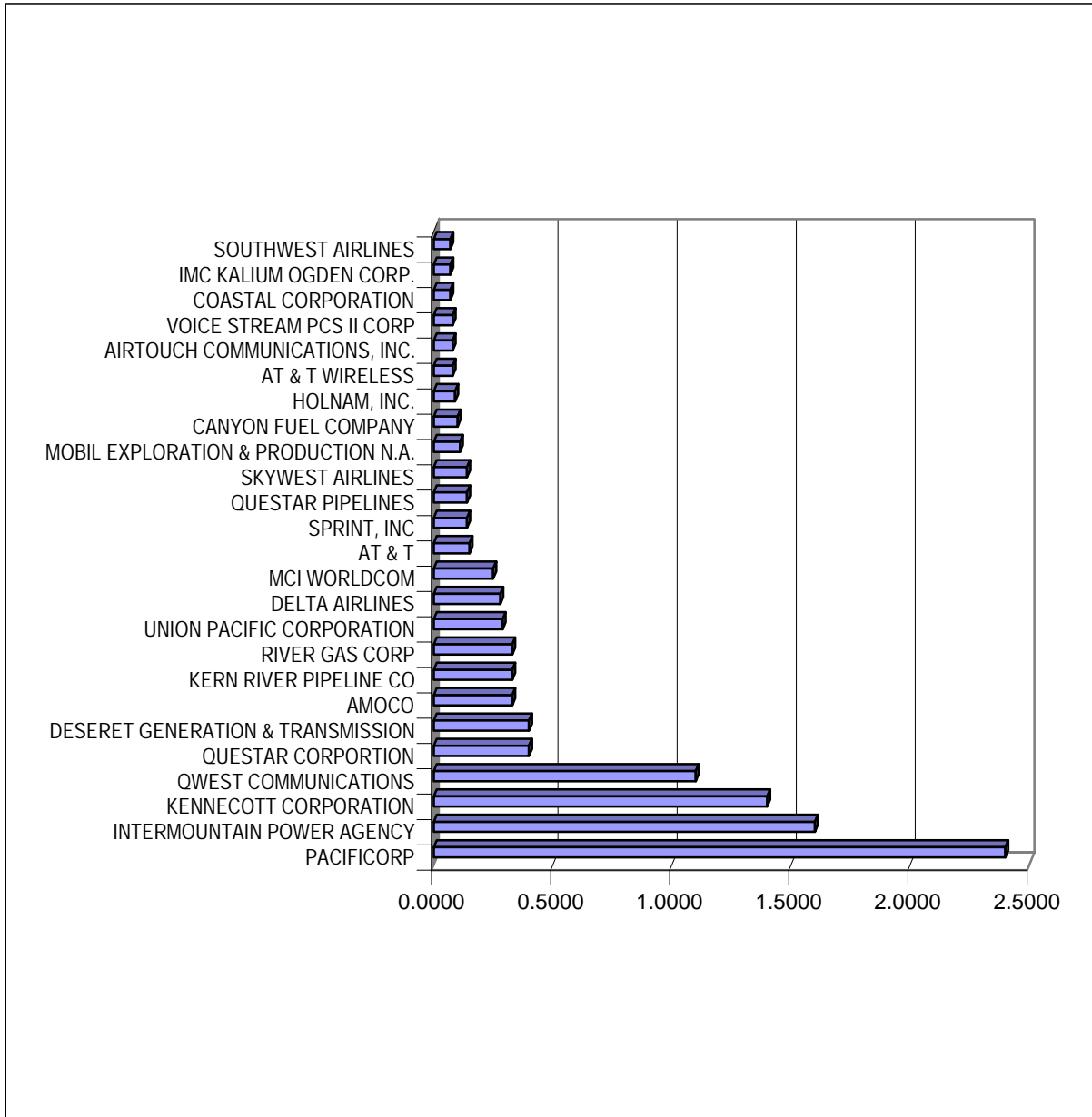
