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OVERVIEW

Property Value

County assessors value all taxable real property, personal property and motor vehicles, referred to as locally assessed property. The property tax division of the state tax commission values utilities, mines and railroads referred to as centrally assessed property.

All taxable property in Utah is valued at 100 percent of its fair market value, based upon its location and status as of January 1st of each year.

Fair market value less any exemptions equals taxable value.¹ Taxable value is the value against which the tax rate is applied to compute taxes charged.

Currently, primary residential properties receive a 45% exemption. Primary residential property is any dwelling used as a person's primary residence, including condominiums, apartments and rental property, and includes up to one acre of land. The taxable value of all other properties except some farmland is 100% of fair market value.

Utah motor vehicles are charged a fee-in-lieu of property taxes. Throughout our statistical report, this will be called "fee-in-lieu".

This report deals with taxable value. The calculation of taxable value is illustrated in the Figure below.

Property Taxes

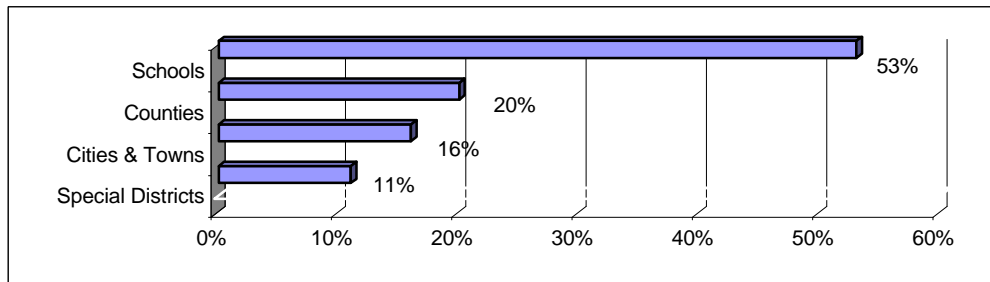
Tax rates are a percentage of taxable value and are not expressed as mills or dollars per hundred of assessed value. Rates are set under a statutory process known as Truth in Taxation.⁵ It requires public notice and hearings in the event a taxing entity plans to increase its property tax revenues above the previous year's revenue, exclusive of revenue from new growth.

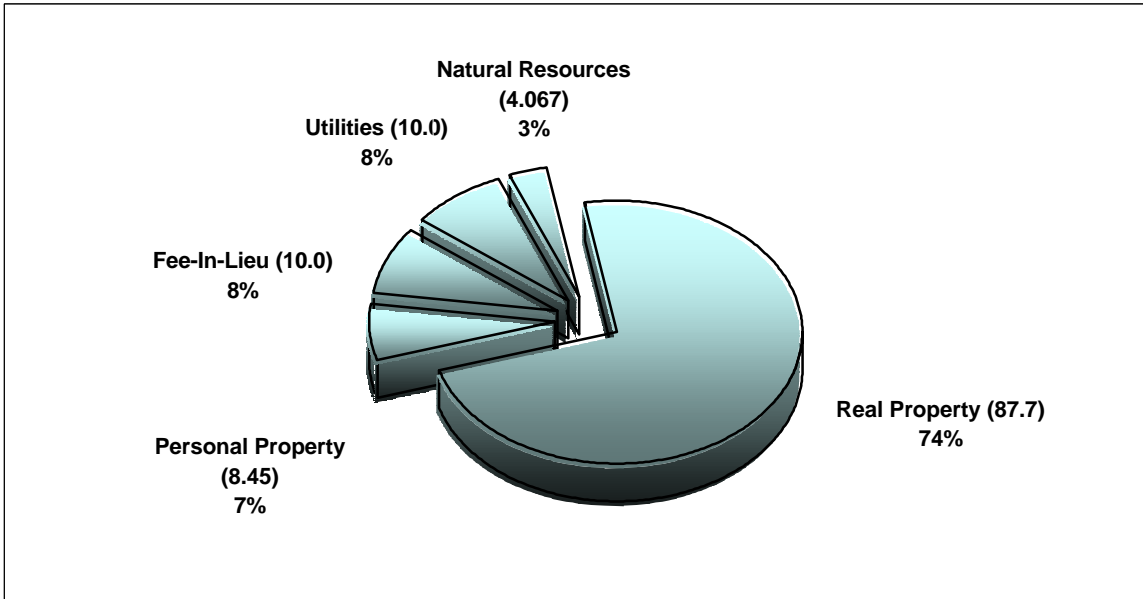

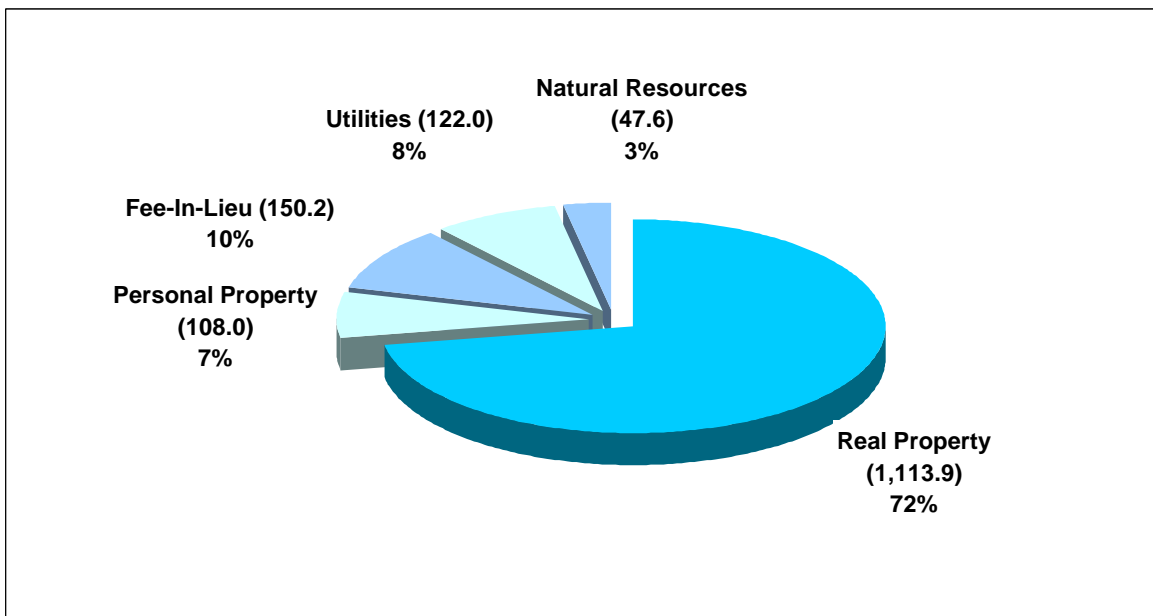

FOR 2001



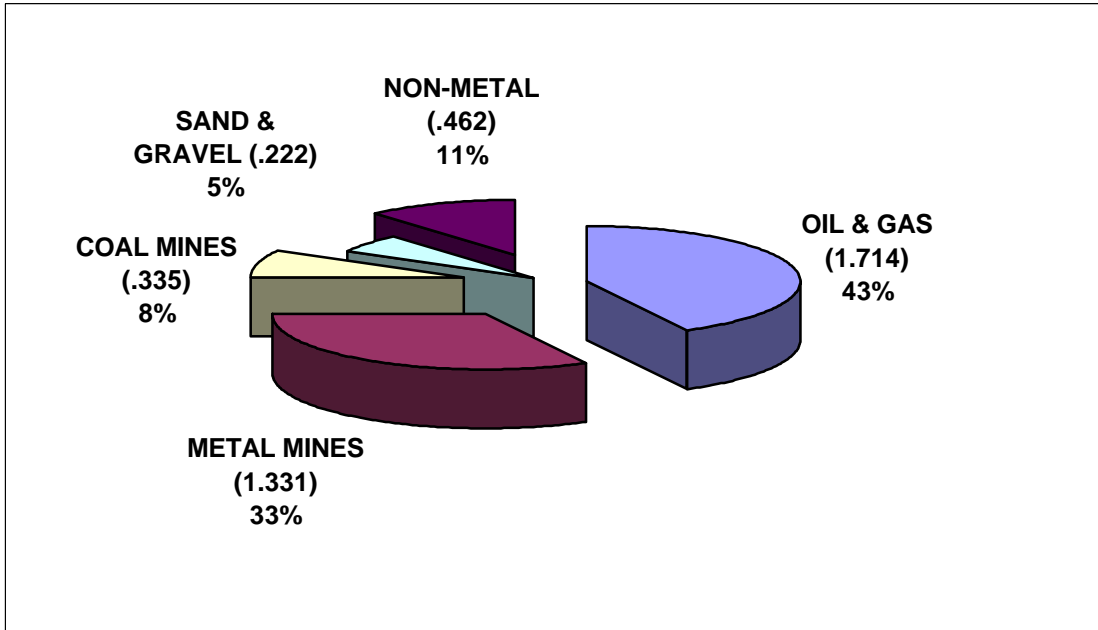

FOR 2001



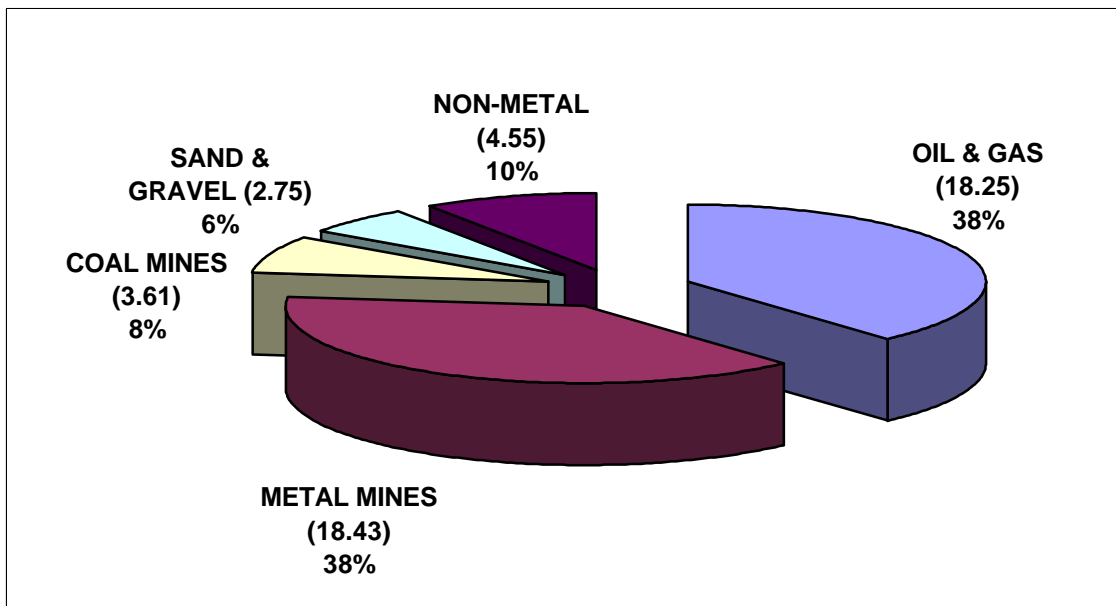

NATURAL RESOURCES



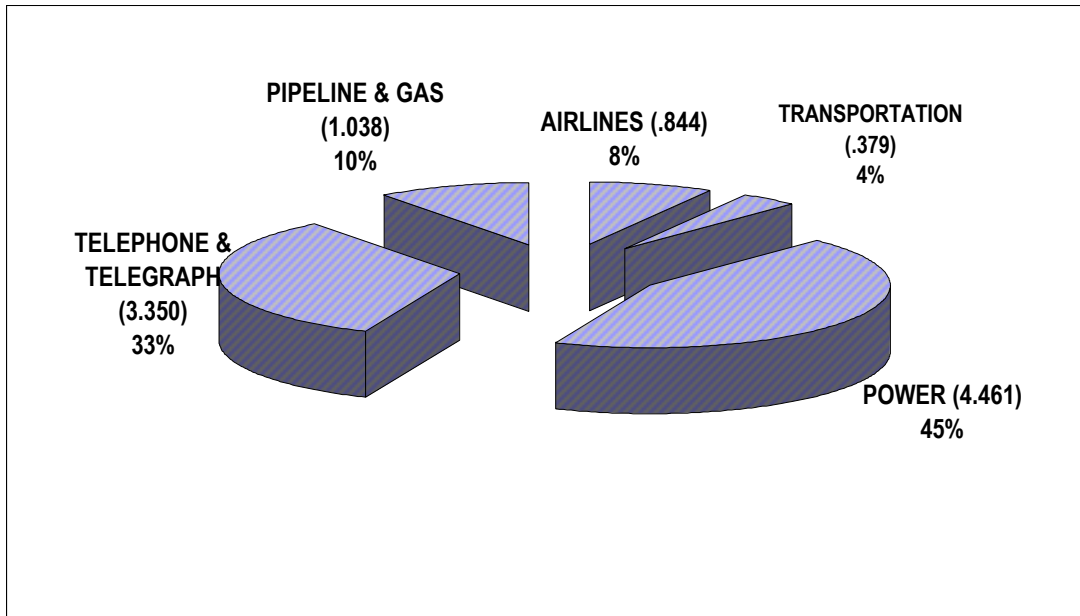

NATURAL RESOURCES



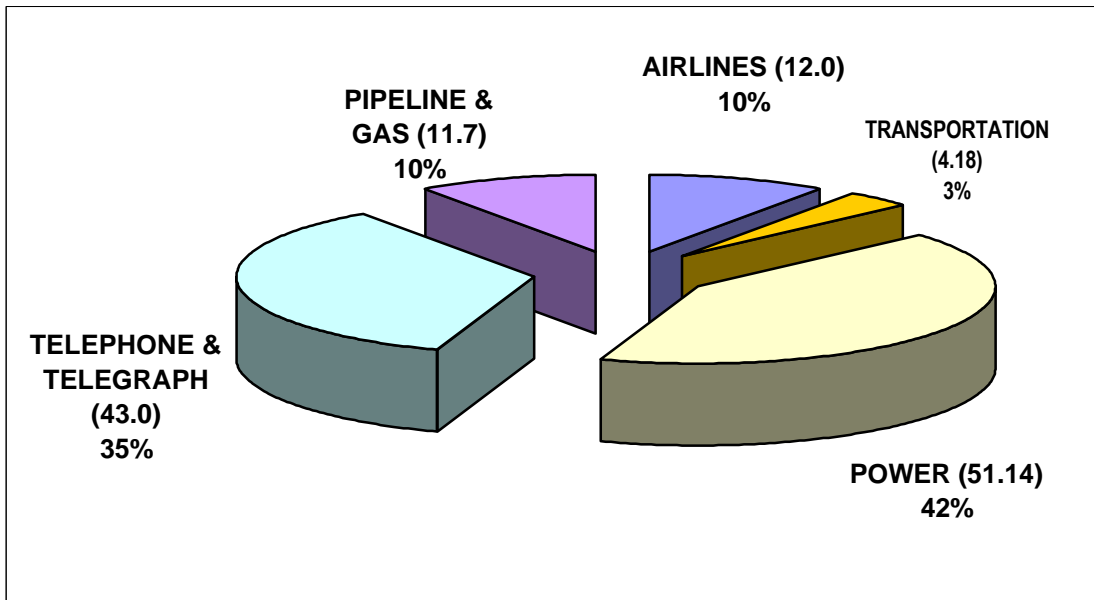

REAL PROPERTY

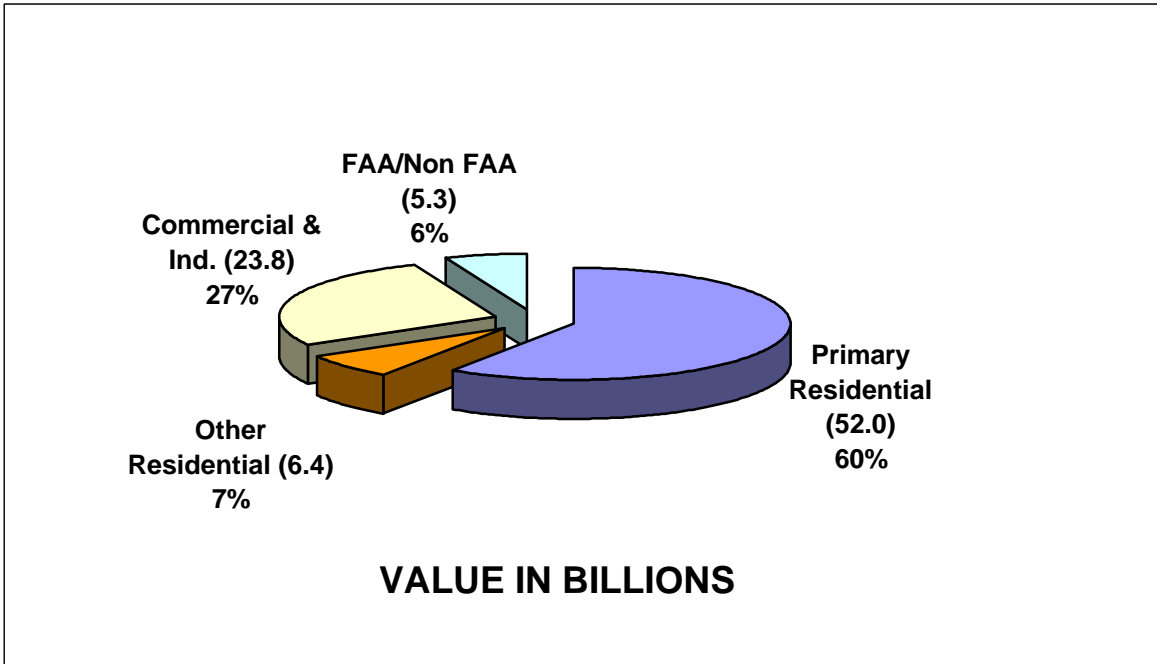

REAL PROPERTY

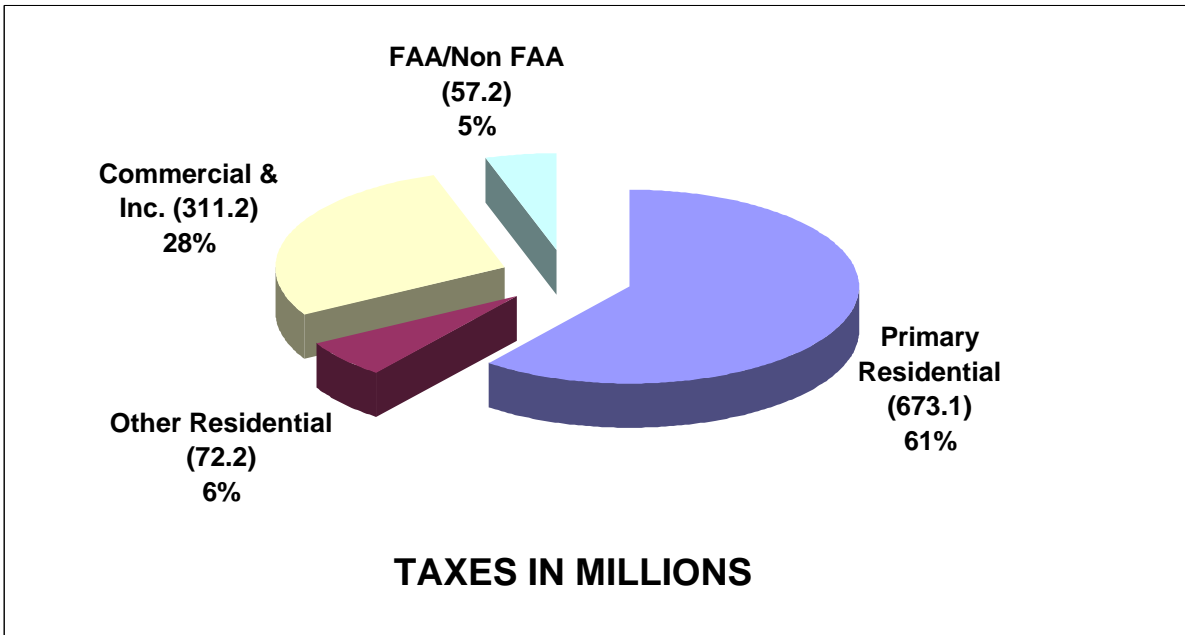

PERSONAL PROPERTY

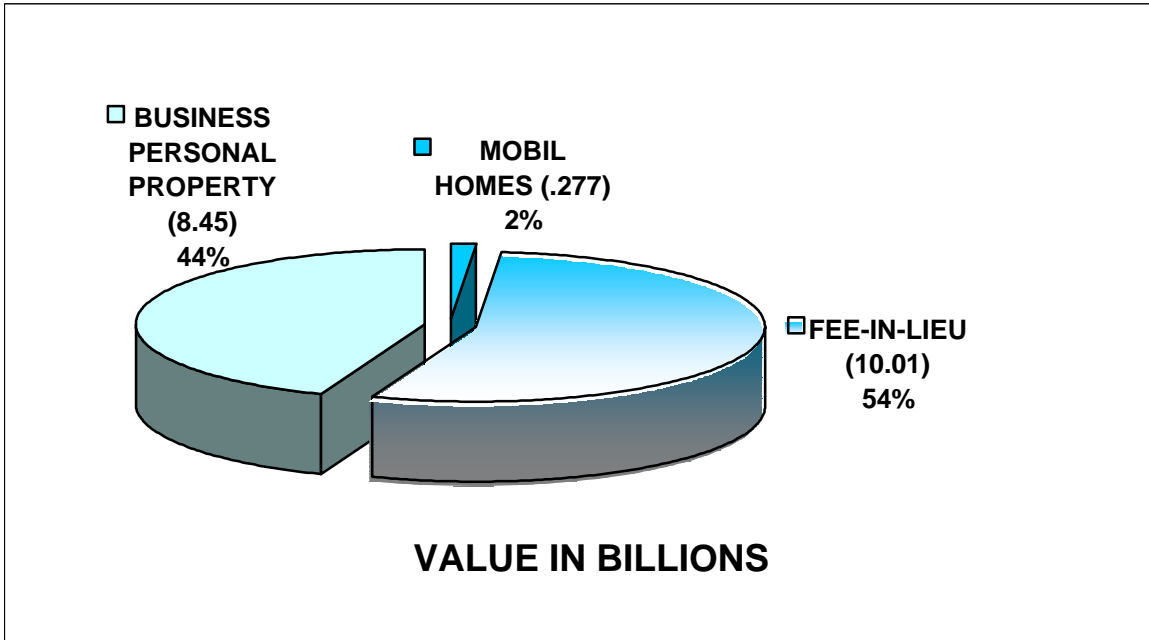
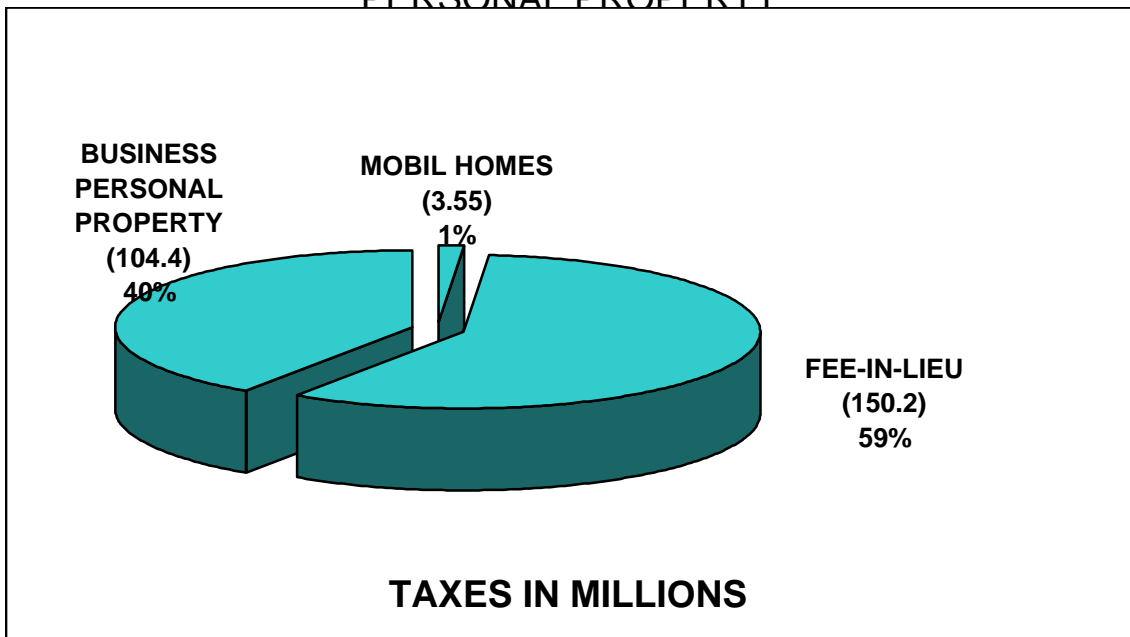

2001

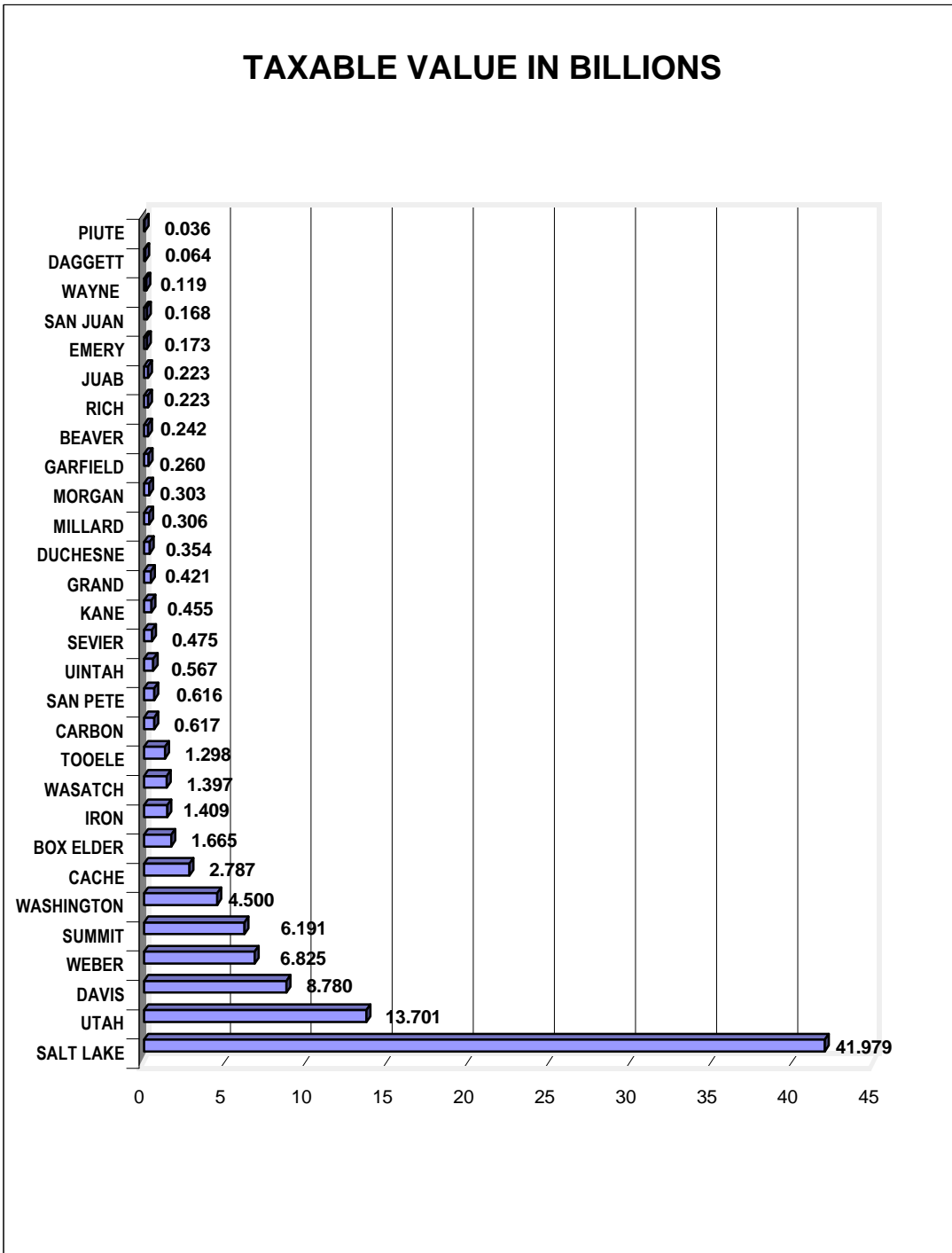

 COUNTIES FOR 2001

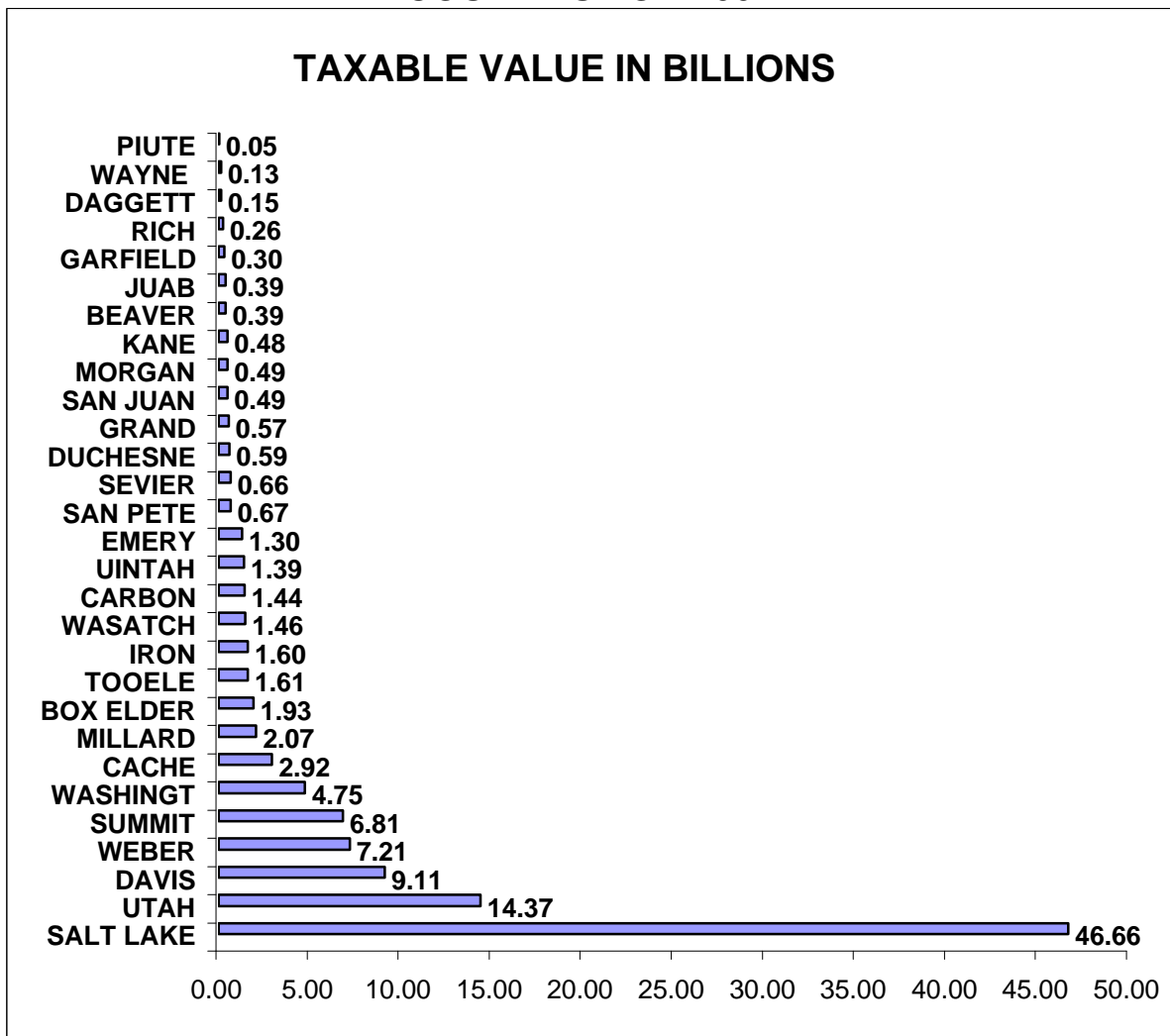

PRIMARY & OTHER RESIDENTIAL COUNTY FOR 2001

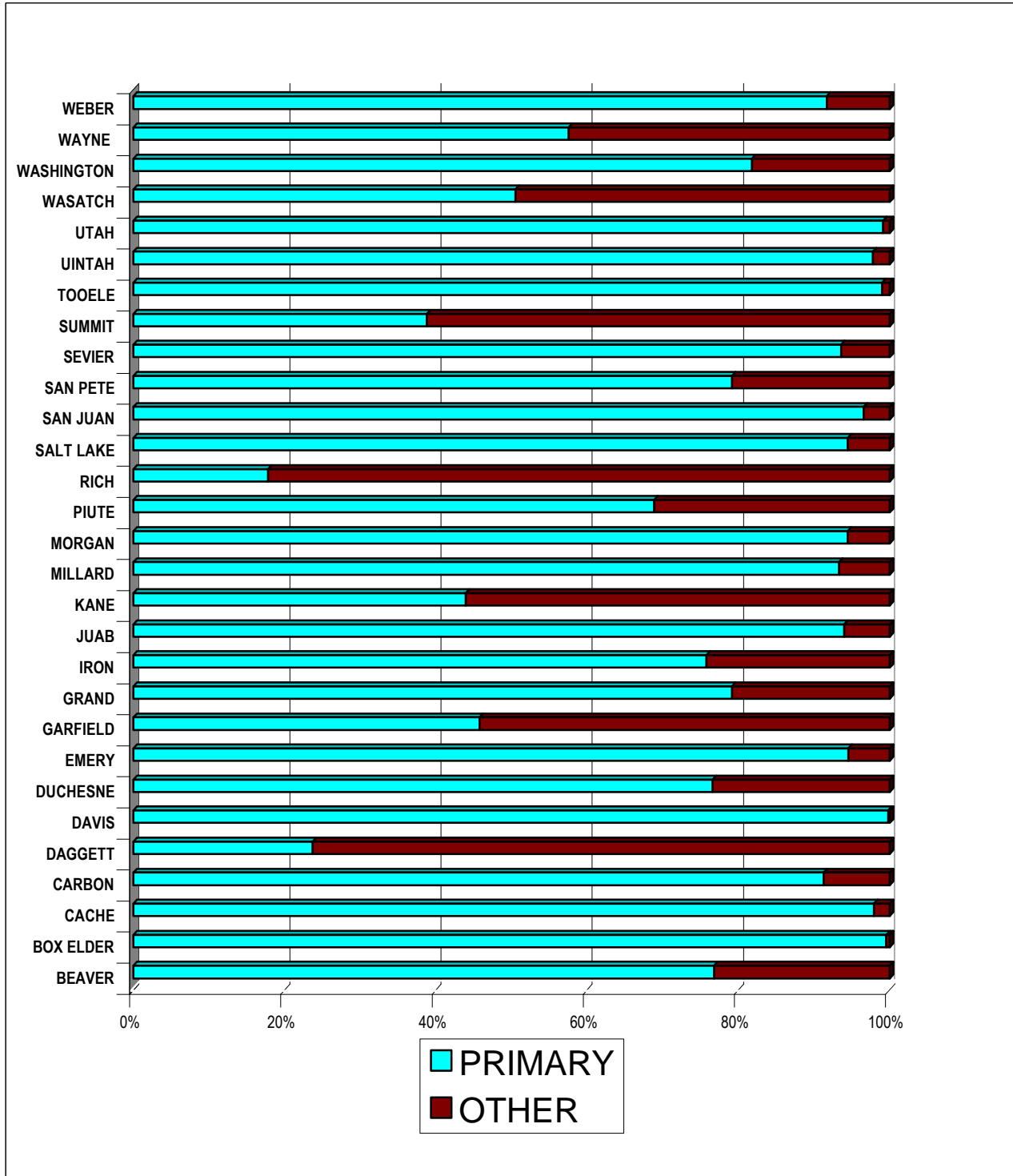

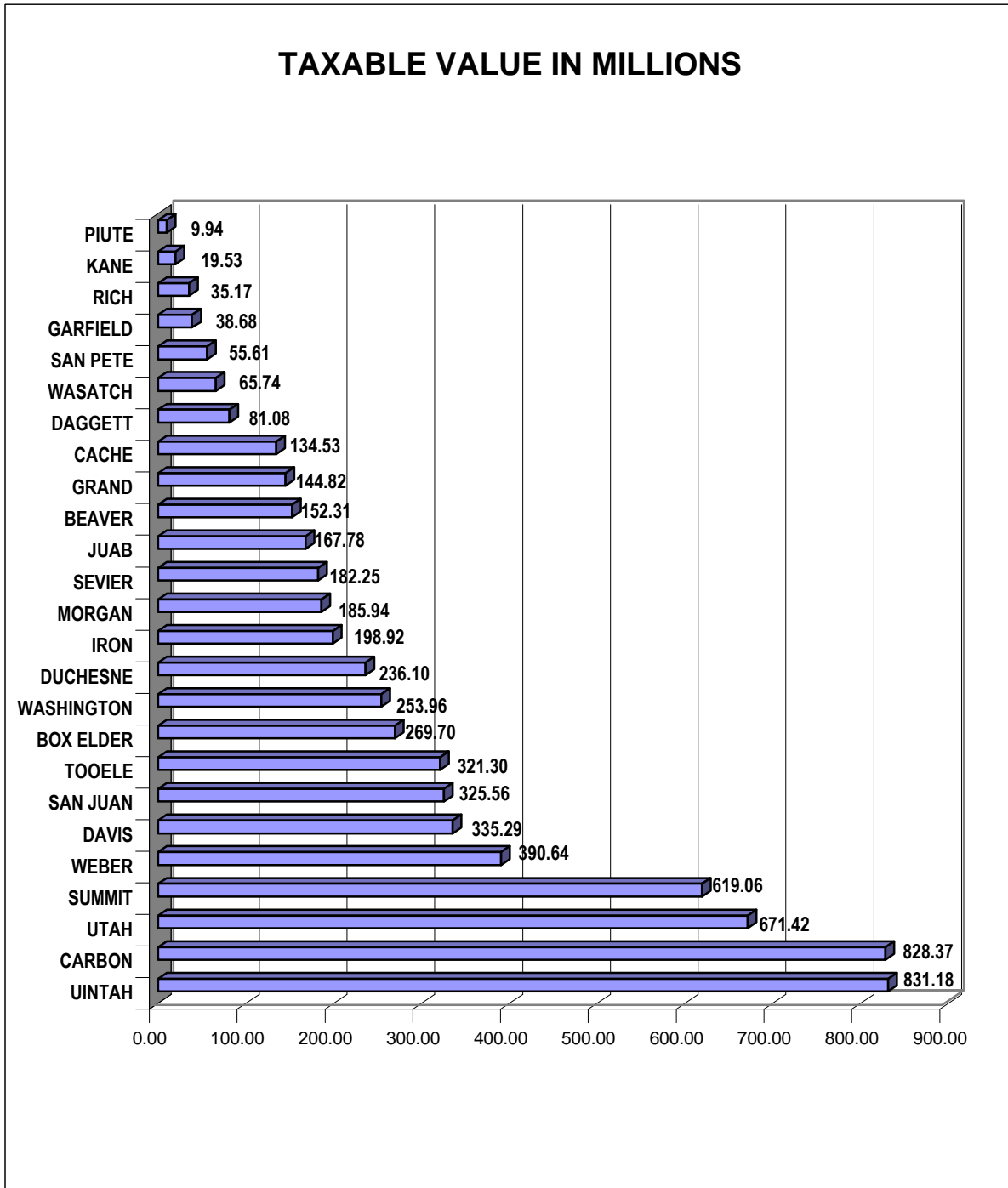

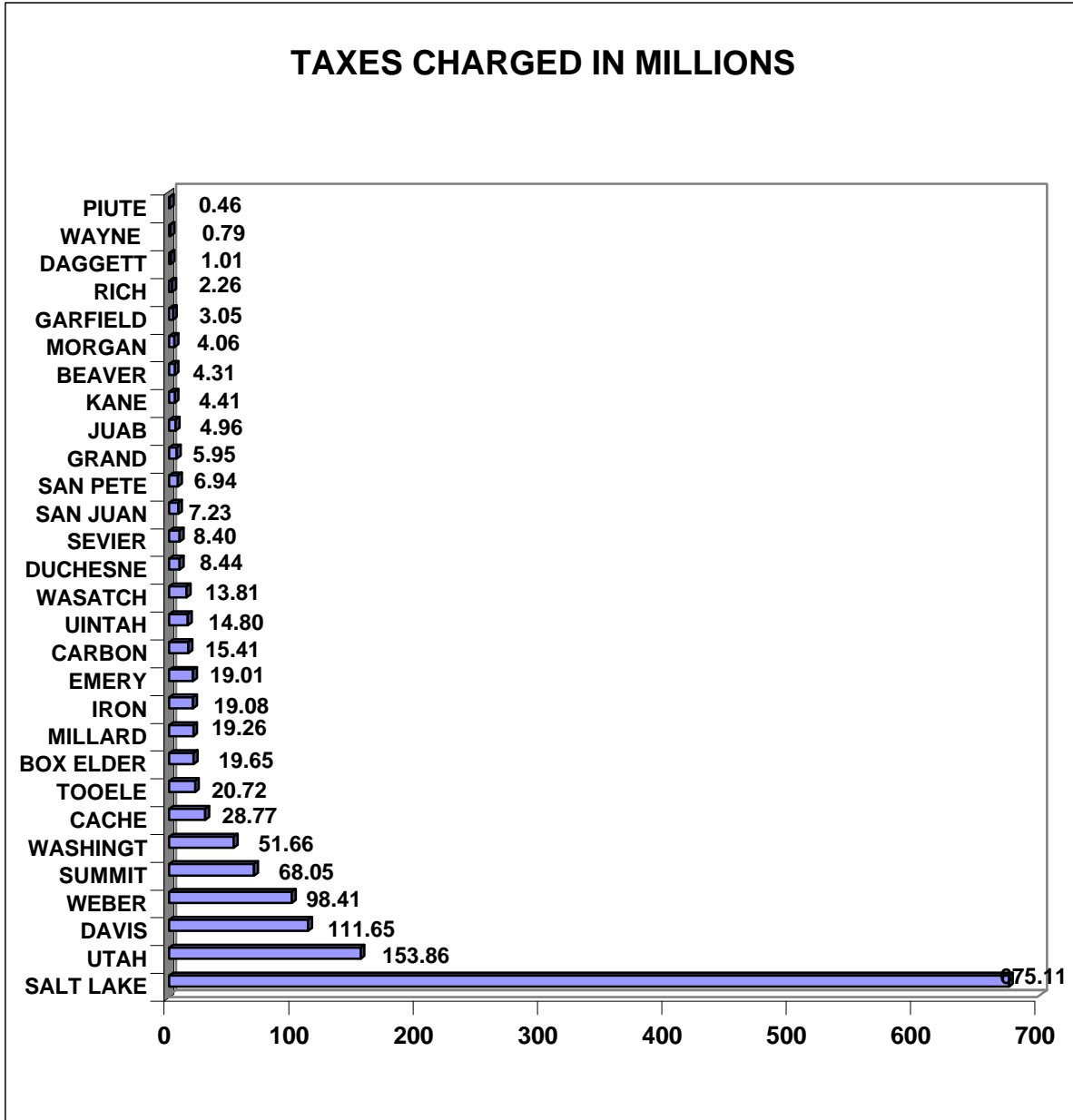

PRIMARY AND OTHER RESIDENTIAL TAXES CHARGED BY COUNTY FOR 2001

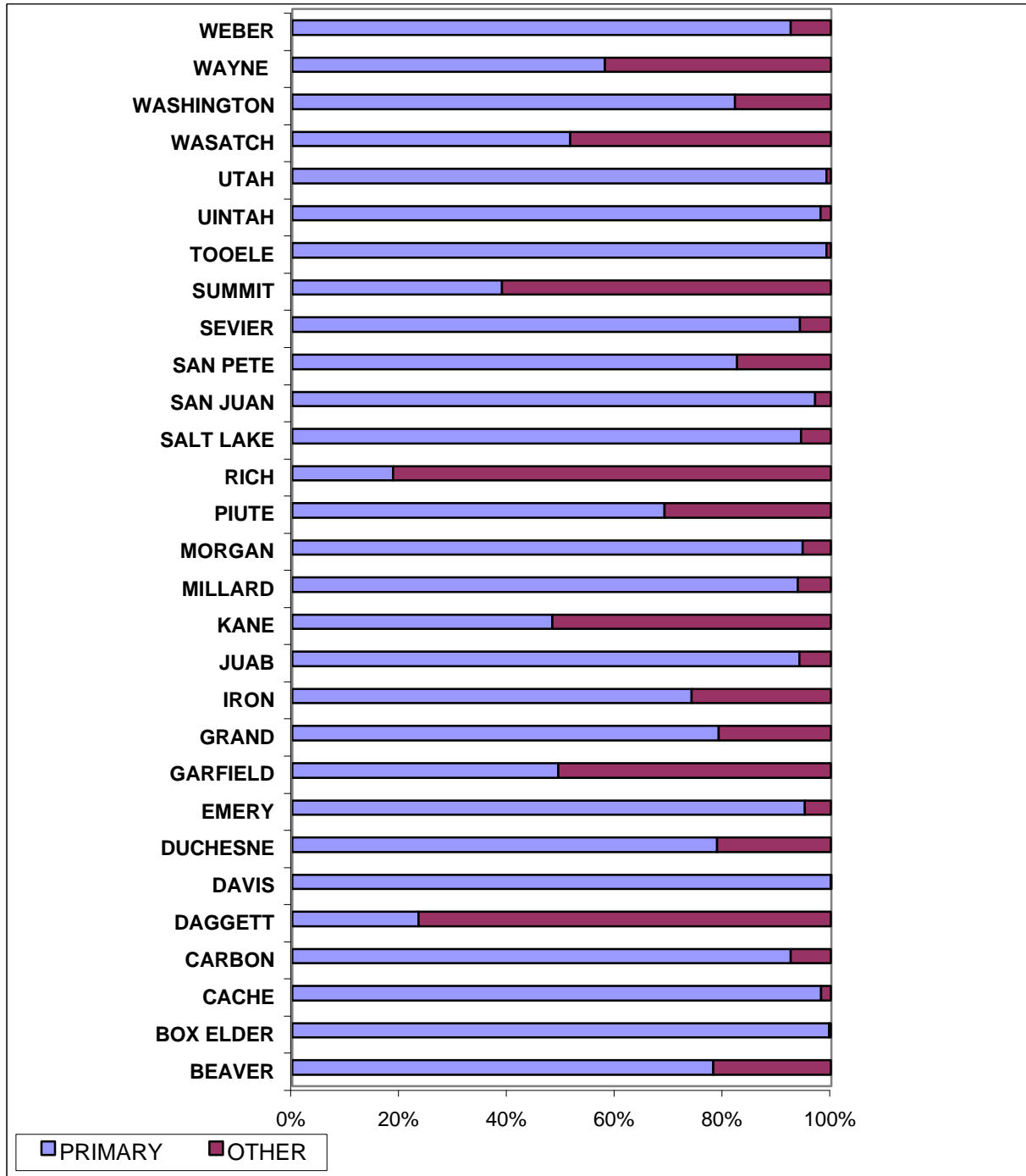

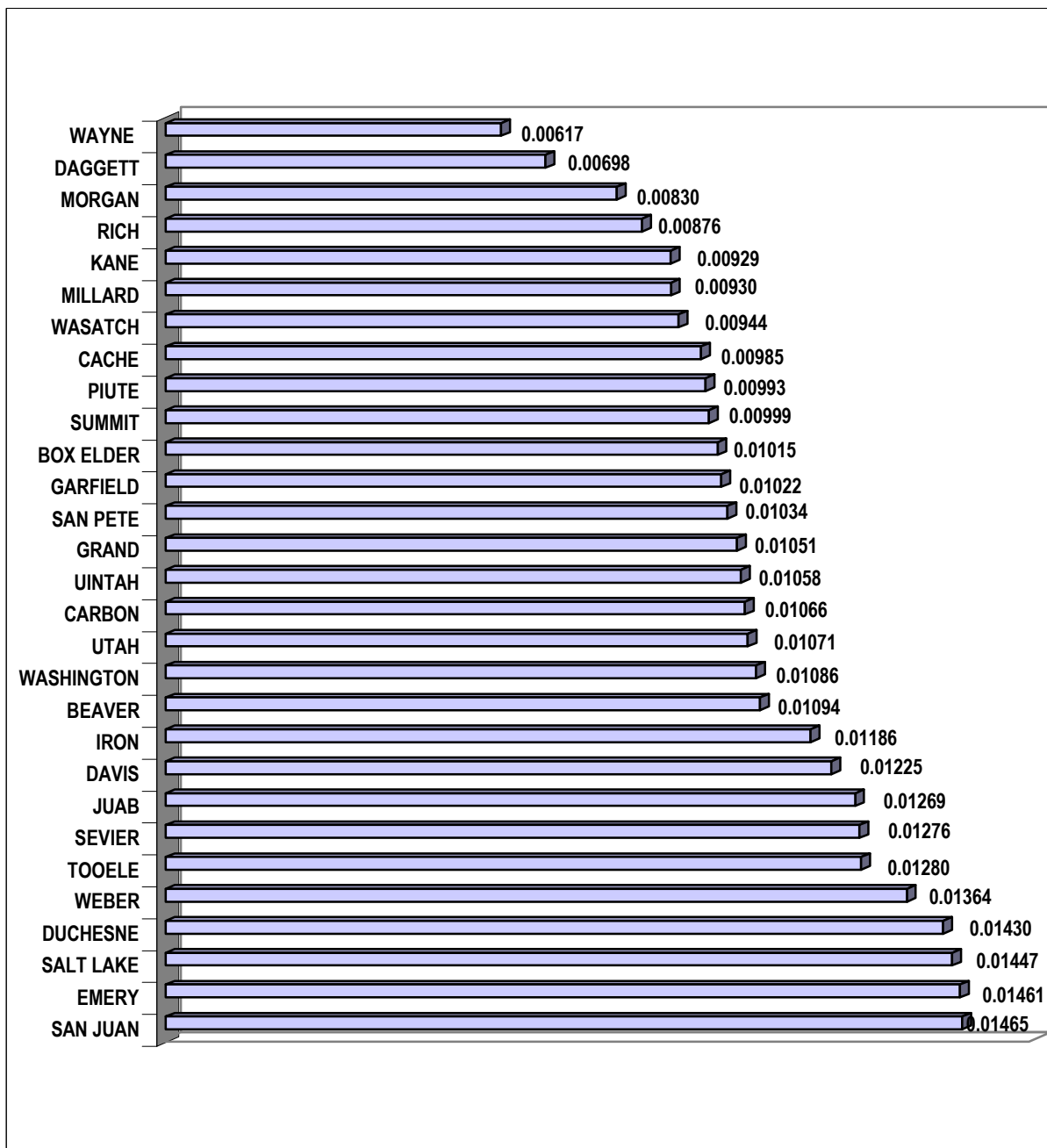

WEIGHTED AVERAGE TAX RATES RANKED BY COUNTY FOR 2001



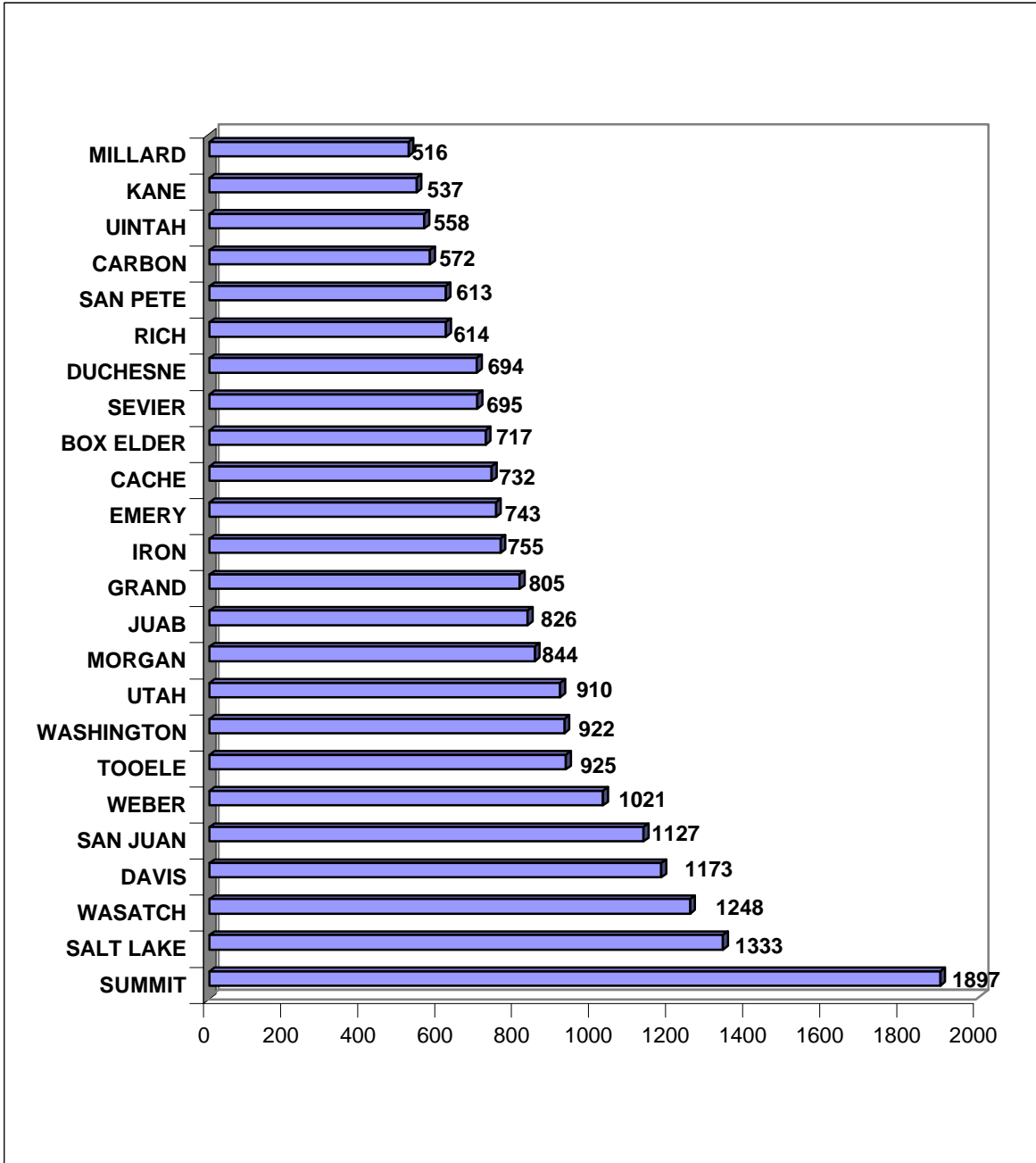

COUNTY FOR 2001



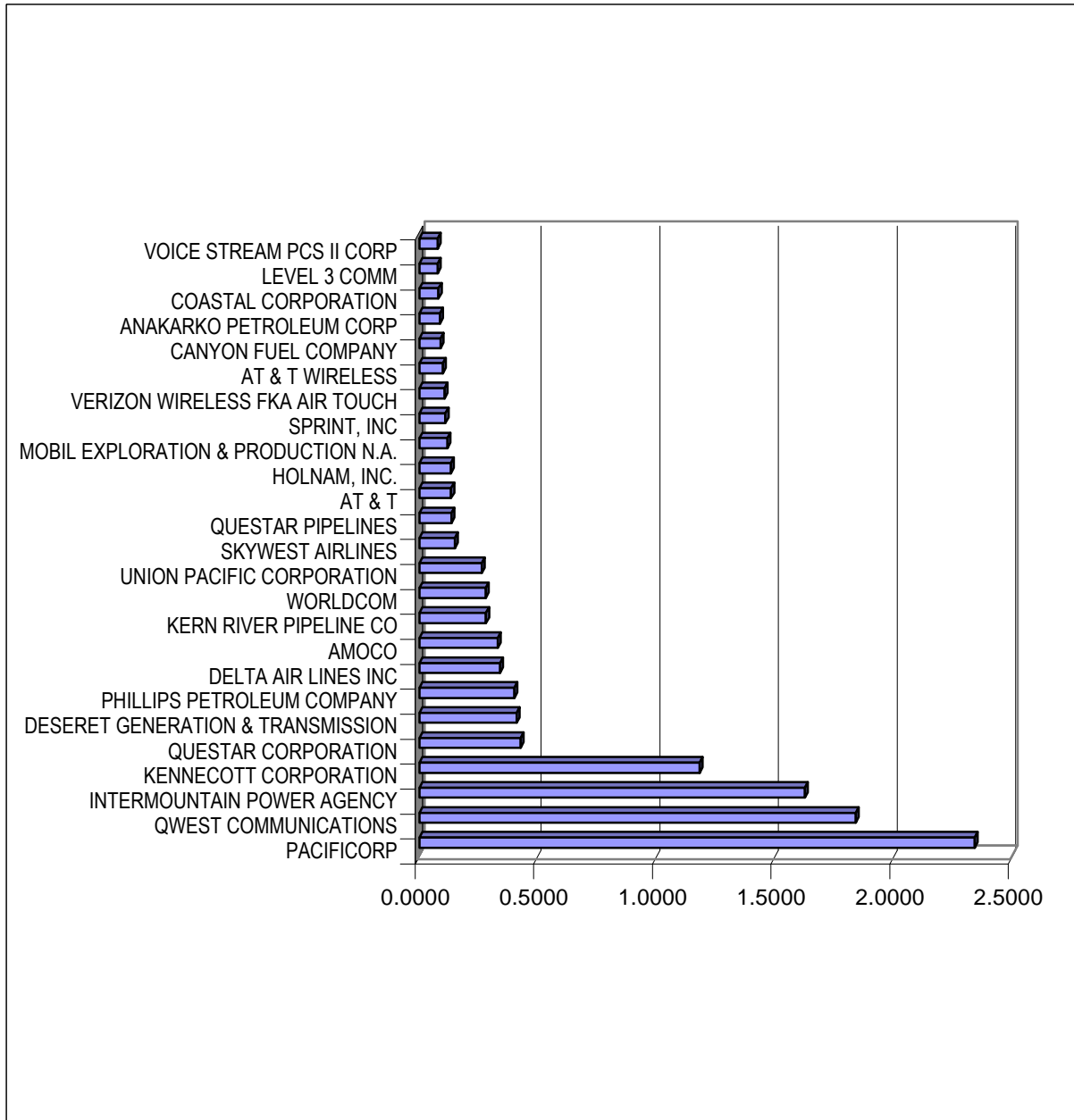

STATEWIDE TAX RELIEF BY CATEGORY FOR 2001

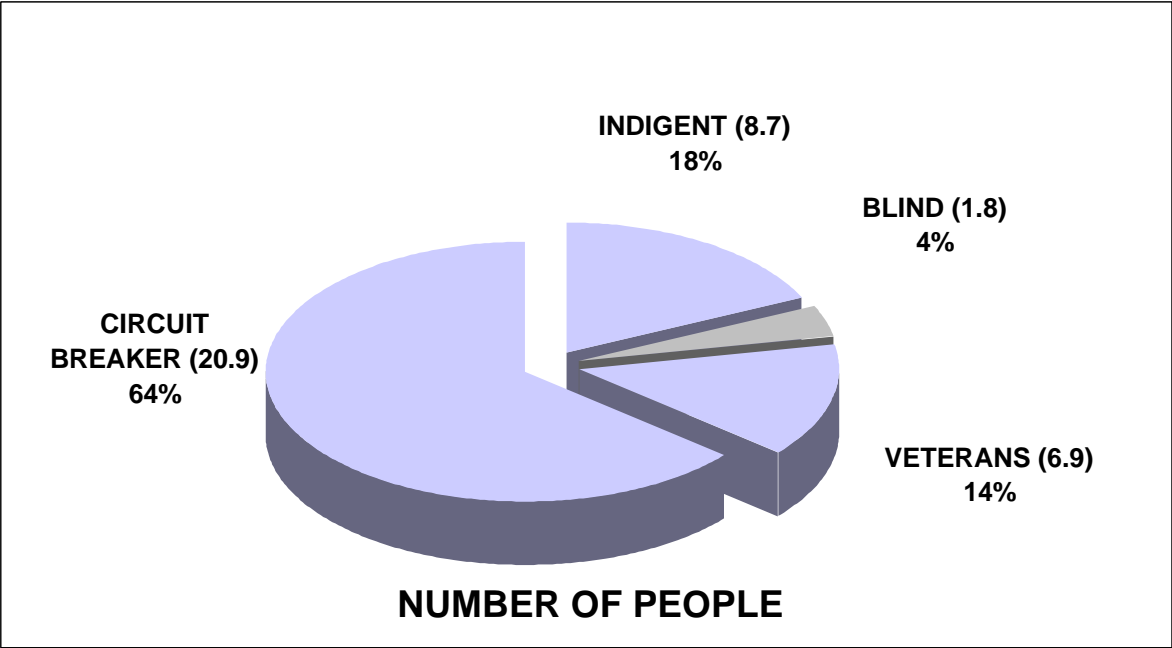

STATEWIDE TAX RELIEF BY CATEGORY FOR 2001

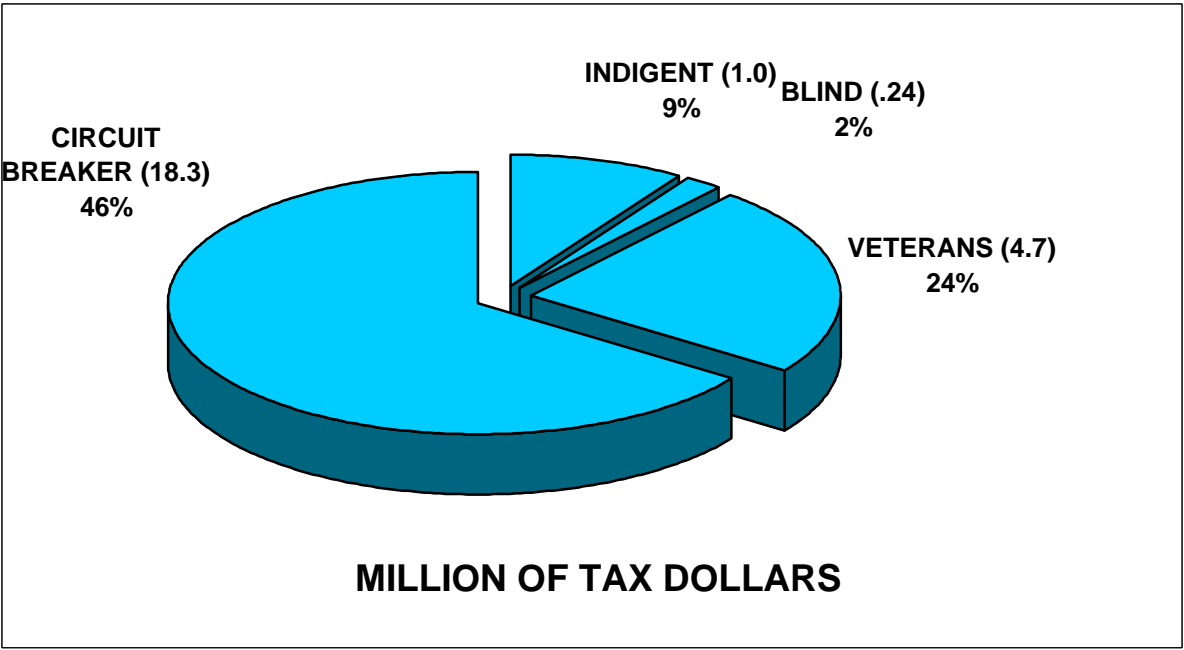
